Overview

Parking Services is responsible for the management of all parking assets on campus. Parking Services provides usable space for over 12,000 students, 1300 staff and faculty, and 10's of thousands of visitors each year. Snow removal is part of the overall management of our campus lots, streets and sidewalks.

Snow Removal Plan 2017-2018

Parking Services and Facilities, Planning and Management are responsible for the safe, efficient and effective removal of snow from the parking lots, drives and sidewalks. Generally, snow is removed whenever there is an expectation of accumulation of 1 inch or more. This is normally done in the early morning hours before the majority of staff, faculty and commuters arrive on campus.



Parking Lot Closures

When there has been a significant single snow fall or sufficient accumulation, it may become necessary to temporarily close a parking lot to allow for a complete clearing. While driving lanes can be effectively cleared, there is often a build-up of snow behind parked vehicles, closing a lot allows for this to be completed. Whenever possible, lot closures will take effect on Friday afternoons, Saturday or Sundays, to ensure the least amount of impact on normal business day operations.

Closure Procedures

If a lot is to be closed, email notifications will be sent and signage posted in the lot at least 24 hours in advance. Individuals will be provided information on where to park on campus while a lot is closed. Information will also be provided on when the lot will be reopened for normal use.
