Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with a CLC advisor and check with the four-year school as soon as the transfer decision is made. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.**

Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees satisfy the university wide, general education requirements (proficiency, breadth and core) but some programs have additional requirements, notably, College of Letters and Sciences and College of Arts and Communication. Also note that the associate degree does **not** automatically satisfy PI 34 (WI Law) requirements for College of Education. The associate degree does not waive the UWW diversity course requirement.

The College of Business and Economics is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. Major programs include accounting, economics, finance, information technology, management, marketing, human resource management, entrepreneurship, integrated science and business, general business and supply chain and operations management. The only major offered entirely online is general business.

#### **Transfer Options**

- **With AA or AS Degree** - University-wide general education courses are satisfied with completion of an AA or an AS degree from CLC. Students should remind UW-Whitewater advisors that they have earned the associate degree to ensure they are not needlessly advised into general education courses.
- **Without AA or AS Degree** - Students who do not earn the AA or the AS before transferring will need to complete specific UW-Whitewater general education courses.

#### **Admission**

- UW Whitewater application is required for admission to the University. Application to the College of Business and Economics is done through a required orientation, advising and registration program (Plan-It Purple).
- **Application to University priority deadline:** Fall, May 1; Spring, November 1
- **Minimum cumulative GPA**
  - University – 2.0
    - Business students with 0 to 24 credits: 2.00
    - Business students with 24 to 71 credits: 2.50
    - Business students with 72 or more credits: 2.80
  - College of Business and Economics – 2.80

- **Criteria for Admission to College of Business and Economics** requires a separate application, completion of
  - 54 transferable credits (including business prerequisite core listed below). Business students are eligible to enroll in lower-division business courses after completing 24 credits with at least a 2.5 GPA.
  - 2.80 GPA.
  - Complete or be enrolled in the following courses:

**Additional Information**

- **International Requirement** – a College of Business and Economics graduation requirement satisfied by taking one of the following courses: ANT 221, 228; ENG 228, 246, 247; GEG 122, 123, 223; HST 126; HUM 128; PHI 126, 221; PSC 221, 222. **Students must meet with assistant dean in the college of business and economics at UWW to ensure the selected course is properly noted in UWW's degree audit. (students typically meet with the assistant dean during their first UWW advising meeting).**
- **Diversity Requirement** – a UW Whitewater graduation requirement and is satisfied by taking ENG 263, 264; HST 240, 241 or CMM 127
- **Maximum hours accepted from a community college** – Up to 72 credits may be transferred from a community college toward the 120 credits required for graduation. Although additional credits may transfer, they will be excluded from the overall 120 needed for graduation.
- **Catalog rule** – Students are responsible for meeting all degree requirements in effect at the UWW at the time that they declare their UWW major, unless they interrupt their attendance at Whitewater by an absence of four or more consecutive academic terms (including Summer), in which case upon re-entry they will be subject to the requirements in effect at that time.
- **Calculation for Admission GPA** – Transfer grades for all CLC transferable course work attempted is calculated into the admission GPA. Remedial courses in math and English are also calculated in the transfer GPA. For repeat coursework, a course in which a grade of C- or below was originally earned may be repeated once for grade and earned credit replacement. The grade and credits earned for the repeated course will replace those earned in the initial attempt when calculating grade point average and credits toward degree. This repeat policy is used in recalculating GPA for admission purposes.
