3. COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO FOREIGN LANGUAGE MAJOR

None. However, the following courses are recommended for students attending MATC during the first and second year.

SPANISH, FRENCH MAJOR

802-211, 802-221 or equivalent (First Semester Spanish or French) OR EXEMPTION 802-212, 802-222 or equivalent (Second Semester Spanish or French) OR EXEMPTION 802-213, 802-223 or equivalent (Third Semester Spanish or French) OR EXEMPTION 802-214, 802-224 or equivalent (Fourth Semester Spanish or French) OR EXEMPTION

MATC students who have earned the Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) Degree will have met all university general studies core, breadth and proficiency requirements. Therefore, students should include the courses listed above as part of the Associate Degree Requirements. PLEASE NOTE THIS POLICY DOES NOT INCLUDE THE ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE (AAS) DEGREE.

Students with previous foreign language study but no university experience in foreign languages must take the appropriate language placement exam and will be placed accordingly.

Retroactive Credit. Up to 16 credits may be granted in French, German and Spanish (4 credits in Chinese and Japanese - which are not majors) for previous language study or other language experience provided the student earns at least a "B" in a follow-up course at UW-Whitewater. (Exception: courses in phonetics and the 390

conversation course.) The "B" grade must be earned in the first course taken at the university level. UW-Whitewater will accept retroactive credits from MATC, provided they are in compliance with UW Whitewater's policy <u>and</u> are listed on the student's official transcript.

Certification for education is available in French, German and Spanish. See transfer guide for <u>Secondary</u> Education for more information.

Minors are available in French, German and Spanish.

Courses in English as a Second Language (ESL) are available.
