SCHOOL OR COLLEGE: College of Education
MAJOR: PHYSICAL EDUCATION (K-12; K-9)
NOTE: Students who do not wish to be certified to teach physical education may declare Health, Human Performance and Recreation as their major.

1. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

UW-System application is required for admission to the university, along with high school and all college transcripts, application fee (if appropriate). Applications for admission to Professional Education are available at the Winther Hall Information desk. Students may apply for admission only at designated times throughout the year. For further information, contact Jillian Smith at 262/472-1184.

2. NON-COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO EDUCATION PROGRAMS

To be eligible for admission to the Pre-Professional Semester, students must have the following:

1. 2.75 minimum GPA on a minimum of 12 credits
2. Passing score on at least two of the three parts of the PPST.
SPECIAL NOTE: admission to the university only requires 2.00. However, to be admitted as a pre-education major, students must have at least 2.75 grade point average. *Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to the College of Education.*
3. Students must have at least 350 hours of experience with learners in teaching-learning situations. At least 300 of these hours must be documented.
4. Attendance at Phase I and Phase II Orientation Meetings.
5. Completion of General Education requirements, listed below.

To be eligible for admission to Professional Education, students must have the following:

1. Attend a Professional Education Orientation meeting;
2. Receive a "C" or better or current enrollment in the three courses contained in the pre-professional semester - available only thru UW-Whitewater);
3. Maintain a "C" or better in speech (COM 103);
4. Have a minimum 2.75 GPA

Grade point average requirements for admission to this program vary from semester to semester depending on space available and number of students applying.

3. COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO SECONDARY EDUCATION

General Education Requirements and General Studies Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has implemented a set of teacher education requirements referred to as PI 34. These rules describe a general education requirement which must be met by all teachers seeking their first teaching license, regardless of previous degrees. To meet PI 34 requirements for licensure, students must complete a minimum of 40 credits and the course requirements in the categories listed below. UW College students who have earned the Associate of Arts and Science Degree will have met all university general studies core and proficiency

requirements. The student should also include as part of the associate degree curriculum, the following course areas:

Composition	ENG 101 (or exemption) and ENG 102
Mathematics	MAT 105
Fine Arts	MUS 173, MUS 273, COM 130 or ART 187
Speech	COM 103 (highly recommended at the College)
Western History or Contemporary Culture	(consult Student Services Advisor)
Non-western History or Contemporary Culture	(consult Student Services Advisor)
Biological Science*	any BIO SCI (ZOO, BOT, BAC, PHS, BIO); BIO 107, ZOO 103 recommended
Physical Science*	CHE, PHY, AST, GEO (4-5 credit lab only), GLG, MLG

*At least one science course must include lab experience.

Students should plan to take 809-239 Child Human Development at MATC.

4. COURSES REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION NOT IN MATC CURRICULUM

EDFOUND 243 Education in a Pluralistic Society; EDFNDPRC 210 Introduction to Education and Teaching.

5. SPECIAL NOTES

- Students should attempt to take Speech (COM 103) at the UW College campus.
- Students are advised to take the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) as early as possible while at the UW College.
