1. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

UW-System application is required for admission to the University, along with official transcripts from high school and all colleges/universities attended, and an application fee (if appropriate).

2. NON-COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION (Health, Human Performance and Recreation emphasis) MAJORS

- First Aid proficiency;
- Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation proficiency;
- Automatic External Defibrillation proficiency.

*All three proficiencies may be satisfied by completing HES 213 at a UW College.

3. COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION (Health, Human Performance and Recreation emphasis) MAJORS

The following courses are recommended to be part of the student's plan of study:

First Aid and Emergency Care	HES 213
Human Anatomy & Physiology	BIO 182 (formerly PHS 170)
Principles and Introduction to Physical Education	HES 204
Nutrition and Weight Control,	HES 209
OR Drugs, Behavior and Society	HES 224

4. SPECIAL NOTES

- Students are strongly encouraged to complete the Associate of Arts and Science Degree from a UW College in order to meet all university general education requirements.
- Students are encouraged to take Introduction to Public Speaking (CTA 103) at the UW College campus.
- An approved minor is required for this major.
