Contact information

Emergency - 911

Non- Emergency 4660 (if no one answers dial 1 for dispatch at any point during the recording)

You can call Police Services if you are locked out of your office, your building or your car. They also can assist you if your car battery needs a jump.

The Police Services webpage (http://www.uww.edu/adminaffairs/police/) has many useful and informative links. You can find information on Crime Prevention, the Daily Activity Log, and information on Registered Sex Offenders.

Emergency Procedures (http://www.uww.edu/news/emergency/) includes links to information pertinent to different situations such as an Active Shooter, Explosion, Gas Leak, Inclement Weather, or other potential threats.

Police Services presented a program called "Shots Fired" earlier this week. They will be presenting this program again over the summer with slight "tweaks".

Building Occupancy – Remember to sign in and out of the Building Occupancy webpage if you are in the office outside of your regular hours. If you come into work early you should also sign in and out. Most people forget to sign out when they leave. This system helps Police Services locate you in case of an emergency.
