Hiring/working with students with disabilities

When hiring a student with disabilities it is important to have a good job description, identify which duties are key to the position. It may be necessary to shift or trade some of the responsibilities with another employee. The student is the best resource regarding what duties they can and cannot do. They are also the best resource regarding what tools they will need to assist them in performing the required duties.

Expectations & Attitude

The expectations should be the same as those for any other student employee. The Student is responsible for him/herself, their service animals (if applicable), and any attendants. We accommodate the disability. Remember that the student is a person.

Examples:

Blindness – Brail Keyboard, Jaws (software that read information on the computer to the user)

Service Animal – if the work area is too small it may be that the student does not bring their animal to work with them.

CSD can assist in finding technical resources or make suggestions to allow the student to perform the required duties. Look at the skills/interests of the student and find a job that best fits them.

Football Field
