## Requirements for the Bachelor of Music Performance Emphasisat UW-Whitewater

### **VOCAL PERFORMANCE MAJORS**

The Music Performance Emphasis consists of 81 units, and includes required coursesand elective options. This Emphasis is intended for the highly qualifiedstudent who wishesconcentrated music study in the area of performance. It is designed toprepare the student for graduate or other advanced study in his/her majorperforming medium. Enrollment in the Performance Emphasis during the firstyear of study is contingent upon the approval of the applied faculty in the student's performing area. Theelection of units in primary appliedinstruction above the minimums stated below requires permission of the instructor. In all cases, acceptance into the Performance Emphasis is to be regarded as provisional, with permission to continue to be determined byperformance before a faculty jury at the end of the first year of study. Asimilar jury must be passed by any student seeking transfer into thePerformance Emphasis.

#### **Required Courses (36 units)**

Performance Majors must enroll in eight semesters of MUSC100, Recital Attendance. This 0-unit class requires that you attend a specific number of concerts and recitals per semester. At the end of each event, you must turn in an attendance slip forverification.

### Ensembles

Vocal Performance Majors must enroll in 8 terms of ensembles.Students who primary performing area is voice must enroll for eightdifferent semesters of Concert Choir or University Chorus.

### Applied Study for Performance Majors

At each level a grade of "B" or better for two semestersis required to pass to the next level. A student failing to meet thesestandards must continue to study at the same level until the graderequirement is met. Units so earned may be applied toward graduation but will not counttoward the completion of the requirement for study in the PrimaryPerforming Area. With permission of the instructor, a student may elect upto four units of private study per semester.

Prior to being admitted to the fourth level of study, astudent must make four solo appearances on departmental recitals. Inaddition, while studying at the 300 level, the student must prepare and present a Junior solo recital of 20 minutes minimum duration.

At the 400 level of study the student will prepare a recital of at least 45minutes of music and will enroll for 150-489 (Senior Recital) during thesemester of intended performance. One month before the intended date of therecital, the student will perform before a faculty jury, which shall decide whether expected standards forpublic performance are being met. Failure to pass this jury and to present recital in public will result in a mandatory grade of "F" in SeniorRecital 150-489 for the semester.

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
