Major Planning Guides are sample programs which illustrate the type of curriculum a student will take to complete the degree in 4 years.

All students must complete a minimum of 120 credits including

- 1) at least 32 units of general education, including specific Gened courses, as well as approved math and science, physical education and elective courses
- 2) requirements for the BA or BS Degree,
- 3) requirements for the major and for the minor if required

* ACT/SAT scores determine which Math and English course is appropriate for you. Refer to your AR for this information and then adjust this schedule accordingly. The Planning Guide begins with the most common placement for this major.

** Bachelor of Arts students must demonstrate that they have achieved basic competency in a foreign language equivalent to one year of study at the college level. Students must also complete two 300/400 level courses outside of the major and minor subjects.

Courses in **Bold** indicate specific courses that must be completed for the major. Other courses such as Gened Courses or major/minor electives can be selected from a number of course choices. The history major requires 6 units of pre-modern history and 18 units of upper division (300/400 level) history courses.
