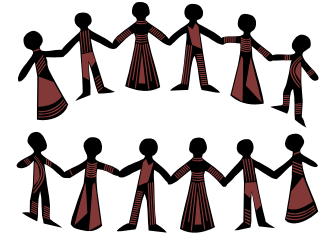

Emphases

(33 Credits)

The International Studies major offers four possible emphases. They are “Foreign Language and Area Studies”, “Business”, “Public Diplomacy”, and “International Economics.” Required courses make up 21 credits, the emphases make up 33 credits, for a total of 55 credits.
