1. Urgent/Priority Business

- Discussion of Academic Innovation Task Force [Reinhart/Curran/Ksobiech]: Kris Curran distributed a synopsis of the Academic Innovation Task Force's strategic plan for academic innovation. The Task Force was tasked with evaluating the need for academic innovation and how to support innovation campus-wide. The Task Force made the following recommendations: 1) appoint an Academic Innovation Director; 2) rebrand the Learn Center to include academic innovation. The Academic Innovation Director would work alongside the Learn Center Director; 3) promote coordination between innovative players in the university and provide structure to leverage new ideas, such as advisory boards strategizing to implement new programs. The Chancellor has received the Task Force's report and requested that they present to all of the governance groups for feedback. Drucker inquired about the means of funding the initiative. The Task Force indicated that if it goes forward, the Chancellor is committed to it. The Director would be half-time teaching, half-time directing and not a new hire. The Graduate School may be able to facilitate the implementation. Rivers noted that student evaluations plummet for the first few years of an innovative course, and asked how innovative material could be introduced without fear of negative consequences. The Task Force discussed this issue with the Chancellor; such courses would have to be designated as innovative and the impact of student evaluations measured differently than for standard classes. Villavicencio observed the focus of the Task Force's recommendations is on the academic piece; support for non-instructional innovation as well would be appreciated. Ehlen advised not housing it in the Learn Center, unless the Learn Center will be changing its academic focus, and perhaps not use the three pillars of faculty experience - service, research, and teaching - to define academic innovation. Action: Email feedback on the Academic Innovation Task Force proposal to David Reinhart.
- b. **Review/Approval of 30 September 2015 Minutes [Ehlen]:** The minutes of the 30 September 2015 Academic Staff Assembly Meeting were approved on a motion from Weber (Fragola, second). Flanagan abstained from voting as he was not present at the meeting.
- c. Review of Ann Luther Retirement Resolution [Ehlen]: On a motion from Flanagan (Tumbarello, second), the Assembly unanimously approved Ann Luther's retirement resolution.
- d. Discussion of Campus Tours/Mentoring for Academic Staff [Ehlen]: Drucker reiterated many of the items on the tour were previously unknown to him and would have been helpful in acclimating to Whitewater. He sees no drawbacks to implementing tours/orientation for academic staff. Tumbarello believes academic staff orientation should be the purview of Human Resources, but is willing to do it if HR is not. Fragola and Ehlen recommended using Warhawk Ambassadors to lead the tours, but Drucker noted their purpose is recruiting, rather than orienting new staff. Rivers added there is need for a full orientation for academic staff, not just the tour. Action: Drucker and Tumbarello will develop recommendations with the Organization Committee and report back to the Assembly.
- e. Update on the University Technology Committee Email Policy [Ehlen]: Ehlen deferred to Fragola as she had attended the 13 October 2015 University Technology Committee meeting. Fragola reported no further discussion on the email policy.
- f. Update on the UW-System Strategic Planning Survey [Ehlen]: Feedback is being collected on all UW System campuses. The follow up survey allowed for three questions, and five bullet point responses to each question. The UWS Strategic Planning Survey group discussed the responses and totaled up common themes. The group will meet Friday, 16 October 2015, to compile a list for UW System. Another campus-wide survey will be distributed to all survey, staff, and students to select the three highest strategic planning priorities to forward to UW System.

- g. Update on the Whitewater Innovation Task Force [Ehlen]: Action: Ehlen will attend the 23 October 2015 Whitewater Innovation Task Force Meeting and report back to the Assembly.
- h. Discussion of Potential Timing and Format of an All Staff Meeting [Ehlen]: Faculty Senate has an all faculty meeting each year because it is required by their bylaws. Academic staff bylaws do not require such a meeting. Ehlen inquired if the Assembly wants to have an all staff meeting. It would provide insight into the concerns of our constituents. Tumbarello recommended some other format than a physical meeting; perhaps an online option or smaller listening session. Action: The Serious FUN Committee will meet with the Organization Committee to discuss options.

iCIT Technology Purchasing/Acquisition Policy

Fragola reported iCIT is taking the lead on a technology purchasing and acquisition policy to ensure third party software providers/vendors are in step with the university's privacy policy. (The draft is attached.) Third party software requests have been declined in the past by iCIT, but this policy outlines which situations require iCIT's consultation and which do not. Deschner inquired about implementing regular legal consultation in regards to these purchases; it normally does not happen. Action: Fragola will provide this feedback to the University Technology Committee.



Instructional, Communication & Information Technology

Foundation/Philosophy Statement

The use of technology in pedagogical settings has evolved at a rapid pace over the past decade. The internet continues to offer unprecedented access to educational content, services, and information. As a result, some services have transitioned from being hosted on campus, to cloud-based offerings in which the hardware, software or content do not reside on campus. The purpose of this policy is to strike a balance between the need to enable campus community to take advantage of rich content available in the cloud and protecting sensitive student and employee information.

Definitions

<u>Third Party Relationship</u>: Any agreement, formal or informal, to utilize services, products, or content that is not generated by the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater and/or is hosted on off-campus servers.

<u>Authentication</u>: Any process by which a system verities the identity of a user, typically though a username/email address and password.

<u>Credentials</u>: personalized login information required to access a secure service or system, typically a username and password combination. (Note: campus credential refer to the Net-ID and password combination, unique to each individual, used to access campus IT-related services).

Third Party Relationships

Third-party entities that require authentication and/or registration to use a service or to view content, exercise data collection practices, and/or track users in any way, may advertently, or inadvertently collect sensitive or restricted information as the result of user activity or system design. Entering into any agreement or relationship to utilize third party services, products, and/or content that requires the use of campus data or credentials, has the potential to elevate IT security risk for the campus and/or for the individual user.

UW-Whitewater has a robust technology infrastructure that enables safe and secure authentication process for cloud based services for students and employees. Examples of secure third-party cloud based services currently offered on campus include:

- Google Drive
- Lynda.com
- WebEx

Policy Statement

ICIT, and other campus offices with applicable data custodianship responsibilities, must be made aware, prior to acquisition, of intentions to procure any third-party digital services, products, and/or content that require the use of campus IT infrastructure or campus data, and/or directs users to share personal information prior to acquisition.



Instructional, Communication & Information Technology

Scenarios in which ICIT must be consulted:

Agreements to receive and/or distribute content from sources that require campus credentials for authentication (username/password)

Utilizing 3rd party web-based services that require student or employee information (i.e. – Student ID, gender, race, etc.).

Acquiring add-ons to previously installed software that is beyond the scope of a standing Service Level Agreement with ICIT.

Entering into an agreement for any service or system that utilizes the campus IT infrastructure.

When directing students and/or employees to utilize third party systems that require personal data and/or campus credentials (i.e. – text book supplements, online training programs).

Scenarios in which ICIT does not need to be consulted:

Systems created and sanctioned by UW-Whitewater faculty or staff that do not utilize sensitive data (social security numbers, student IDs, Ftc.) and do not use third-party networks or IT infrastructure.

Systems that do not require users to enter personally identifiable information and/or campus credentials. (i.e. – a YouTube account). Personally identifiable data includes photos and videos of the user.

Utilizing systems in which the user can choose or create their own username and password combination (e.g. – distinct from Net ID/password). Utilizing campus email addresses to set up third-party accounts is acceptable, when the chosen password is different from the password utilized to access campus services.

Signing up for individual accounts or subscriptions used for the sole benefit of the individual user (e.g. – not compelling others to sign up for a service).

Username/Password Best Practices

Users should never utilize their campus NET-ID and password combination as a username/ password for a third party offering, unless access is approved by ICIT.

Third Party Email Communications

When a University-issued email address is provided to a third-party, whether it is required or voluntarily submitted, the user may receive emails from that third-party (i.e. marketing emails, password reset emails, etc.). It is the responsibility of the Office(s) or Department(s) acquiring the third-party service to be aware of the volume and the extent of the email communications that will be received by the third-party service provider. ICIT will not actively prevent third-party emails from reaching their intended recipients unless the emails are deemed potentially harmful to the campus network.

Resolution Presented to Chancellor's Cabinet on September 28, 2015

Resolved that:

The University of Wisconsin-Whitewater adopt a tobacco-free campus policy, banning the use of all tobacco products. This ban is understood to include any product that includes tobacco as well as electronic vaping devices and hookah.

The University of Wisconsin-Whitewater develop a voluntary compliance system for implementing this policy, along with educational efforts aimed at ensuring compliance.

The University of Wisconsin-Whitewater establish a Tobacco-Free Campus Committee, charged with promoting voluntary compliance with the tobacco-free campus policy and education for tobacco users and others on campus.

Tobacco use exemptions are limited to only:

- a. Using tobacco inside one's own vehicle; and/or
- b. Religious ceremonies; and/or
- c. Research purposes in a controlled laboratory setting.

This tobacco-free campus policy will go into effect on September* 1, 2016.

Highlighted sections designate sections that were changed after the 2014 resolution due to feedback from governance groups.


*It is recommended that an August 1, 2016 implementation date be utilized to avoid confusion amongst students who arrive prior to September 1st.

Chancellor's Task Force

- WSG and TFC requested the chancellor form a tobacco policy committee with representation from all of the governing bodies.
- The charge was to investigate tobacco policy at UW-Whitewater, and make recommendations for policy change, if necessary.

Task Force Recommendations

The following resolution was proposed to the Chancellor:

Policy to Governing Bodies

UW-W Student Survey Results

Spring 2015

955 students participated in the American College Health Association survey

Questions: Do you support a voluntary UW-Whitewater policy prohibiting use of tobacco, including hookah and electronic vaping devices on campus grounds?

Results: overall, 65.2% of students reported supporting an 100% tobacco free policy.

UW-W Student Support

- UHCS would support this program and train students to enforce policy through education. Student would hand out "reminder cards" to violators and utilizing positive reinforcement for those who follow the policy.
- Monitors would report any problems of concerns to the implementation committee.

Chancellor's Tobacco Task-Force

Report and recommendations on tobacco policy at UW-Whitewater

ABSTRACT: This committee was convened at the request of Chancellor Richard Telfer to investigate tobacco policy at UW-Whitewater, and make recommendations for policy change, if necessary. After a substantial review of evidence from peer institutions, health experts, and policy stakeholders at UW-Whitewater, we recommend UW-Whitewater adopt a 100% tobacco free policy. This report includes a rationale for this policy recommendation, and concrete guidelines for how to implement this policy change.

Report and recommendations on tobacco policy at UW-Whitewater

I. Committee process

The Chancellor convened this task force to: "(1) Examine existing UW-Whitewater policies related to smoking and tobacco use. (2) Examine existing UW-system policies as well as Wisconsin State Statutes related to these issues. (3) Examine, where appropriate, policies on other college and university campuses related to these issues. (4) Make recommendations related to UW-Whitewater policies. These could be recommendations that existing policies remain as they are. They could be recommendations that existing policies be modified or new policies adopted."

Given this charge, this committee met seven times between January and April of 2014. Our investigation involved an examination of the academic literature on tobacco use and tobacco policy, an examination of UW-Whitewater policy and the policies in place at other institutions, interviews with numerous stakeholders on the UW-Whitewater campus and in the surrounding community, and interviews with the chairs of "implementation committees" at other universities that have adopted tobacco-free campus policies.

In general, we tried to arrive at decisions unanimously. When disagreement did occur, we reached a decision with a simple majority vote.

II. Assessment of tobacco policy at UW-Whitewater

Our investigation concludes that the tobacco policy in place at UW-Whitewater is inadequate, inconsistent with practices currently in place at other colleges and universities, and inconsistent with "best practices" recommended by public health experts. The principal statute in place for regulating tobacco use is a prohibition on smoking in enclosed spaces on campus (i.e. residence halls; academic buildings) as well as within twenty five feet of residence halls. In the course of our investigation, we heard from numerous parties on campus who argued this policy was insufficient. In addition, Whitewater designates specific smoking areas during athletic events, and prohibits smoking within twenty-five feet of building entrances. In the course of our investigation, numerous parties reported the twenty-five foot rule was not followed, and it was insufficient to protect them from secondhand smoke. In addition, the rule needs to be updated to include nicotine-based products such as e-cigarettes, which are not covered under the current policy.

Our investigation concludes that UW-Whitewater's current policy is inconsistent with college campuses across the United States and in the UW-system. According to the American Nonsmokers Rights Foundation, there are currently 1182 campuses in the US that are smoke-

free, 811 of which are 100% tobacco free.³ In Wisconsin, this list includes peer institutions such as UW-River Falls and UW-Stout. UW-Stevens Point also recently adopted a 100% tobacco free policy.⁴

Finally, UW-Whitewater's current tobacco policy is inconsistent with the best practices advised by virtually all health policy experts, including the Surgeon General of the United States, ⁵ the American College Health Association, ⁶ the American Lung Association, ⁷ and the American Cancer Society. ⁸

IV. Policy recommendation

We recommend UW-Whitewater adopt a 100% tobacco free policy. Consistent with other model campuses, we do not recommend a policy model that disciplines policy violations. Rather, we recommend relying on voluntary compliance with the policy. Implementation will be overseen by a tobacco-free implementation committee, as defined below.

Tobacco products are meant to include but not be limited to any product that contains tobacco, as well as e-cigarettes and hookah.

A rationale for this policy change and suggestions for effective and fair implementation are outlined below.

V. Rationale for proposed policy

We urge UW-Whitewater to adopt a 100% tobacco free policy for several reasons:

(1) A 100% tobacco-free campus is consistent with "best practices" advocated by college health and public health experts. As noted by the American College Health Association, "environmental tobacco smoke has been classified as a Class-A carcinogen and that there is no safe level of exposure to environmental tobacco smoke (ETS), a recognized toxic air contaminant." In addition, we recommend that "e-cigarettes" and hookah be included in the definition of tobacco products. While research in not yet conclusive on the long term consequences of secondhand e-cigarette aerosol inhalation, several recent studies indicate e-cigarette aerosol contains a number of harmful toxins, 10, 11 and suggest these products could be harmful to users and non-users alike.

(2) Students at UW-Whitewater support both a 100% tobacco-free and smoke-free campus [See Figure 1 below]. Attitudes of 1496 students, faculty, and staff were assessed on a survey conducted in the fall of 2011. 64.9% (62.7% of students) were broadly supportive of a smoke-free campus, and 56.28% (52.9% of students) were supportive of a smoke-free campus. To further examine the generalizability to the student body, we weighted these results to adjust for an oversample of freshmen (who tend to be less-supportive) and women (who tend to be more supportive). The weighting did little to affect the substantive implication of these results. These percentages are comparable to those at UW-Stout shortly before they implemented their tobacco-free campus, and Stout has enjoyed considerable success and a high rate of voluntary compliance.

(3) A strong majority of stakeholders we contacted support a 100% tobacco-free campus. We contacted a wide variety of campus and Whitewater community members to ascertain levels of support, and to seek suggestions on policy implementation. Responses revealed clear support for a tobacco-free campus, including support from (a) a college dean, ¹⁵ (b) the city manager in Whitewater, (c) a representative from Marketing and Media Relations, (d) representatives from the Whitewater business community, (e) a representative from facilities management, and (f) representatives from University health and counseling services. While other parties did express concern with the prospect of a tobacco-free campus, support for a tobacco-free policy clearly outweighed dissent. In cases of dissent, we also sought feedback on how a tobacco-free policy could be implemented in a way that would be most acceptable.

(4) Tobacco-free campuses are associated with positive outcomes for students.

Research indicates campus-wide tobacco-bans are associated with lower prevalence of smoking, lower exposure to secondhand smoke, a decline in the belief that smoking promotes weight loss, an increase in the preference to socialize in a smoke-free environment, and increased agreement with tobacco-free policies. ^{16, 17} In addition, given that tobacco use is correlated with other negative behaviors such as high-risk alcohol and drug use, ¹⁸ as well as lower academic performance, ¹⁹ a policy that reduces tobacco use could, by extension, generate other positive benefits for tobacco free campuses, such as less cigarette litter (i.e. butts on the ground) near building entrances. ²⁰

(5) Other campuses have reported a positive or neutral effect on undergraduate admissions/applications.

One possible objection to a tobacco-free campus is the concern that it may have a negative impact on admissions if students who use tobacco choose not to apply to a tobacco-free school. While college applications are effected by a number of factors making the exact impact of tobacco-free policies difficult to ascertain, this objection is clearly not supported by recent experience at other UW-system schools. Douglas Mell (chair, implementation committee) at UW-Stout reported applications are at or above levels where they were before the tobacco-free policy was implemented. Keven Syversen (chair, implementation committee) from UW-River Falls indicated his institution also experienced continued high applications.

VI. Suggested implementation strategy

While an effective tobacco-free implementation strategy needs to be specific to the unique needs of a particular campus, our investigation uncovered several "common denominators" which improve the success of a tobacco-free policy. In general, a successful tobacco-free policy needs to engender a norm of healthy tobacco-free behavior on campus. We do not recommend a system that disciplines policy violators (citations, academic misconduct reports, and negative work performance reviews). Instead, we recommend treating policy violations by educating tobacco users on campus about the campus tobacco free policy. We will rely on the university community to actively monitor and educate tobacco users of the campus policy. We also recommend the creation of an ad hoc "tobacco-free committee" that handles complaints and responds to potential problems. The specific guidelines below are drawn from highly effective implementation strategies already in place at UW-Stout and UW-River Falls. They are also consistent with tobacco-free campus policy recommendations reported in academic

research,^{21, 22} and the Center for Disease Control's recommendations for implementing a tobacco-free workplace.²³ While there were initially some questions as to whether an implementation strategy without penalties would be effective, the experience of other UW campuses suggests that the approach outlined below which relies on voluntary compliance will significantly reduce tobacco use at UW-Whitewater.

- (1) The centerpiece of an effective implementation strategy is a tobacco- free committee. Leading up to the policy's implementation date, this committee will be charged with communication to students, faculty, staff, and campus visitors. Following the implementation of the policy, the committee will continue to handle outreach to the community, serve as a focal point for any concerns that come up with respect to the policy, investigate violations of the policy, oversee students charged with monitoring the policy, and troubleshoot any potential problems in real-time.
- (2) **Committee composition.** We recommend inviting numerous stakeholders from across campus to be represented on the tobacco free committee. Specifically, we recommend including (a) a student representative from WSG, (b) a representative from Facilities Management, (c) a representative from Campus Police, (d) an at-large member from the community/Starin Park neighborhood, (e) a representative from Health and Counseling Services, (f) a representative from Faculty Senate, (g) a representative from the Academic Staff Assembly, (h) a representative from the Classified Staff Advisory Council, (i) a representative from the Dean of Students Office, (j) a representative from Residence Life, (k) a representative from the Admissions Office, (l) a representative from the University Center, (m) a representative from Athletics, (n) a representative from marketing and Media Relations, and (o) a student representative from RHA.

It may be desirable to include tobacco users and non-tobacco users on this committee.

(3) **Tobacco monitors.** UW-Stout has had success by asking students to monitor compliance by their peers. "Tobacco monitors" would walk through campus and hand out "reminder cards" to those violating the policy. Cards would remind students and visitors of the policy, direct them to the tobacco-free committee website with any questions, and provide information on where to find tobacco cessation resources. While UW-Stout has a team of dedicated tobacco monitors, we recommend charging UHCS student workers and interns with this responsibility. In the early days of policy implementation, we also recommend a strategy of positive reinforcement, by handing out small "thank you" coupons and/or small incentives for students who have walked off campus to use tobacco products. Tobacco monitors will report any problems or concerns to the tobacco-free committee.

(4) **Communication of policy.** An effective communication strategy is key to a successful implementation strategy. First and foremost, this should involve a comprehensive website that can be easily linked to from the main UW-Whitewater homepage. We encourage developing a website modeled after the effective UW-Stout website²⁴. The website should include (a) a clear statement of the campus policy and a rationale for the policy, (b) information on how to contact the committee, (c) resources for tobacco users, and (d) answers to frequently asked questions.

Following implementation, communication and education need to be ongoing. This should include ongoing reminders to campus visitors (such as a statement of the policy included in conference materials and announcements at athletic events).

- (5) **Resources for tobacco users.** We acknowledge that a tobacco-free policy needs to be accompanied by sufficient tobacco cessation resources for users. We recommend this effort be spearheaded by Health and Counseling Services.
- (6) **Timeline for implementation.** Given the importance of education and communication, we recommend a one-year delay between policy adoption and policy implementation. During this time, an educational campaign will occur. In the months before policy implementation, signage should be posteded in key locations around campus, campus visitor materials should be updated to reflect the new policy, email reminders should be sent to current and incoming students, alumni and community members should we notified of the new policy, and any new contracts should have language included to reflect the campus policy. The student newspaper, campus welcome events, and Plan it Purple should be used to inform students of the new policy.
- (7) **Costs.** We acknowledge that there will be budgetary considerations associated with implementing the proposed policy. Most costs will occur early in the process as we install signage, update written materials, and educate the campus community. After implementation, we expect costs to be minimal. In addition, there will be some cost savings associated with the proposed policy change (for example, lower maintenance costs associated with cleaning tobacco waste).
