COST OF INSTRUCTION

All cost of instruction charges are non-allocable charges. These are charges directly related to the instruction. These costs are subsidized (matched) by monies from the State Budget for all Resident Students.

SEGREGATED FEES (Mandatory costs)

Segregated Fees are charges that are recommended or reviewed by student government representation and approved by campus administration to support student services in a stable funding environment. In general allocable fees are those that support student activities and non-allocable fees support fixed financial commitments, like contracts, debt retirement, and university student service programs.

Segregated Fee Explanation:

Activity Fee: The activity fee is used to support various activities. Some examples are recreation sports, athletics, child care center, organized activities and municipal services.

Textbook Rental: A service that provides textbooks to be rented by undergraduate students, rather than purchased for each course offering.

Student Center: The fee supports facilities, services, and programs at the James Connor University Center.

Health Center: This fee supports quality health services (medical, public health, and wellness/outreach).
