

## 3-YEAR COURSE SCHEDULING FOR BUSINESS MAJORS

The following is an example of how courses might be scheduled to complete a business degree in three years. The plan would differ for students majoring in international business, management computer systems, and integrated science and business, because those majors start their majors earlier, but generally, this plan applies. Students majoring in accounting, finance, economics, management computer systems, and integrated science and business are required to take a calculus course.

Courses in **bold** are required for admission to the College.

\*Business core courses (Business Communication, Business Law, Business Finance, Organizational Behavior, Operations Management, Marketing Principles) are required for all majors in the College of Business and Economics.

### Admission to the College of Business and Economics Requirements

To take upper division business courses as a business major you must first be admitted to the College of Business and Economics which requires:

1. Have 54 or more projected units (credits). Projected units are the number of units that will be earned at the end of the present term.
2. Have finished or be registering for the last courses in the **unique and lower division requirements**, and **communication skills**.
3. Have passed the Computer Applications Test (CAT) or completed COMPSCI 162 Computer Applications course.
4. Have earned a combined (transfer and UW-W) cumulative gpa of at least 2.8.

#### **NOTES:**

- **Management computer system majors** start their programming and lower level requirements as freshmen, but can complete the major in four years.
- **Integrated science and business majors** start taking the science courses required in the major as freshmen and continue through the sophomore year.
- **International business majors** are required to take 16 credits of foreign language and three specific courses that count for general education electives and diversity: Political Science general education course, a religious studies general education course, and Cross Cultural Communication.
