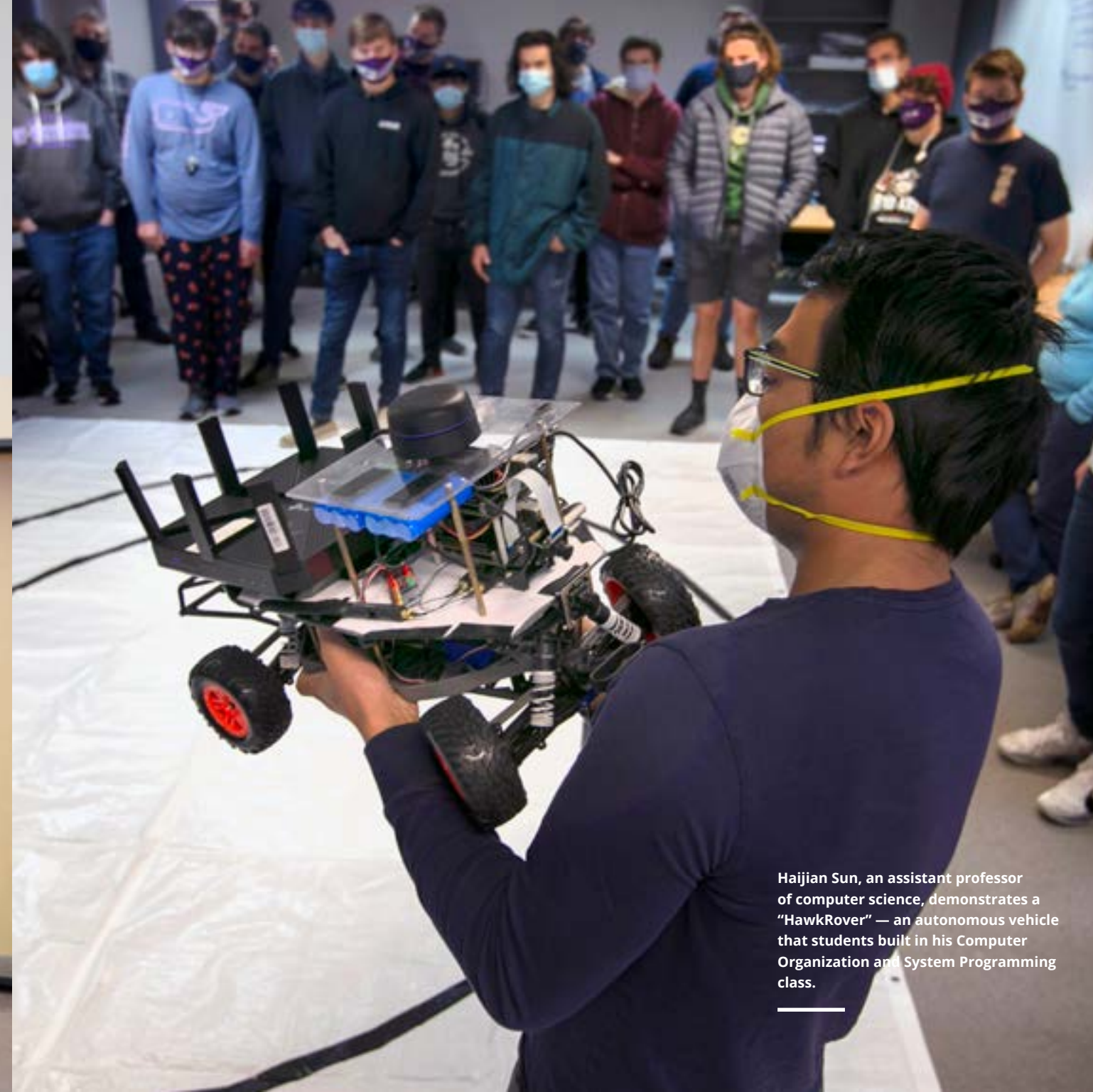

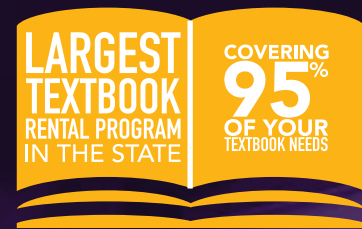

### CENTER FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

UW-Whitewater is known as being one of the most accessible campuses in Wisconsin, with about 10% of students using the services of the Center for Students with Disabilities. The center actively collaborates with students, faculty, and staff to create an inclusive, accessible university experience.

### STUDENT DIVERSITY, ENGAGEMENT AND SUCCESS

UW-Whitewater works hard so that students from diverse backgrounds are challenged to reach their goals as they are supported along their path to success and contribute to a thriving university culture. The Office of Student Diversity, Engagement and Success supports the mission and core values of UW-Whitewater by providing programs that enhance, engage, and support students for success in their academic programs and beyond.

### PB POORMAN PRIDE CENTER

The Pride Center offers an open and welcoming space for all LGBTQ+ and ally students to relax, study and socialize. It serves as a hub for sharing information about LGBTQ+ resources and services on campus, including all-gender bathrooms, inclusive housing, trans healthcare, and the campus-wide use of preferred names and pronouns.
