Purpose of study and results

The Community Action Coalition of South Central Wisconsin (CACSCW) is required to conduct triennial community needs assessments to learn about emerging issues and unmet service needs related to poverty in Jefferson, Waukesha, and Dane counties. Two faculty with two undergraduate students conducted and analyzed data from six focus groups, plus analyzed Community Commons data to uncover community needs. Results suggest needs persist in the three counties, and community members appreciate current resources provided by the CACSCW. Results also reveal additional needs including a stronger connection to resources in the way of information, transportation, availability and emotional support. Recommendations are outlined in the full report.

Though primarily a contribution to the CACSCW's needs assessment request, our findings are part of a larger report that will be used to update the organization's strategic plan which drives how CACSCW makes decisions about the direction of agency programs and available resources.
