Purpose of study and results

At the spring 2017 UW-W Community Breakfast, Kristin Wallace, Executive Director, Rock River Free Clinic, expressed the need for a Spanish translation of a directory called "Where to Find," providing contact information for food pantries, housing, legal aid, and medical assistance. Hard copies of the English version are routinely distributed through area clinics/food pantries; however, Spanish-speaking community members are at a considerable language disadvantage in accessing/using this information.

The project's goals were twofold: (1) create a Spanish version of this directory; and (2) to assess the impact of this translation on generating inquiries from and requests for assistance by the region's Hispanic population. Dr. Ksobiech will follow-up via online survey and focus groups to determine to what degree, if any, the Hispanic population of these counties found the translation to be (a) useful, and (b) if they utilized the information therein.
