Homecoming Champion's Trophy

One Champion's trophy will be awarded in each division (Greek, Student Organization, and Residence Hall). Points will be accumulated throughout Homecoming week by participating in events. The group in each division receiving the most points will be awarded the Champion's trophy at the football game on October 25th against Stevens Point. **Champion's points are not applied to the Chancellor's Spirit Cup.**

The decision of the Homecoming Steering Committee is **FINAL**.

Chancellor's Spirit Cup

One Spirit Cup will be awarded in each division (Greek, Student Organization, Residence Hall). **Spirit Points are not applied to the Champion's trophies.** Homecoming Steering Committee members as well as designated campus employees will award spirit points.

Points will be distributed based on overall spirit, support of Homecoming, support of Warhawks, attendance during Homecoming Week activities, and assisting with community service. The group in each division receiving the most points will be awarded the Chancellor's Spirit Cup at the Football Game on October 25th. (See Page 7 for more hints.)

The decision of the Homecoming Steering Committee is **FINAL**.

The Homecoming Champion's Trophy and Chancellor's Spirit Cup are presented by the Chancellor and are designated as traveling trophies. Thus, the 2008 recipients of trophies and cups will be permitted to retain the trophy for display, recruitment, and/or other organizational purposes until **October 1, 2009**.

Chalking

NO SPRAY CHALK IS ALLOWED.

Chalking is only allowed outside on horizontal surfaces that are exposed to the elements. Only sidewalk chalk may be used. Infractions that are corrected to the satisfaction of the Homecoming Steering Committee will not have points deducted. Defamation of others' chalking is prohibited.

Body Paint Policy

Absolutely no masks of any kind will be allowed at the Dance on October 20th or at the Variety Show on October 22nd. **Face paint will be allowed from the neck up for all Homecoming week events.**

Licensing

Participation points apply only to organizations who do not place in that event.

Additional points can be earned towards the Champion's Trophy by completing projects, selling buttons, attending general meetings and other activities.

Points will be awarded as follows:

General Meeting Attendance

50 points per meeting. Each group must have at least two representatives and no more than five. Attendees must sign in.

Special Projects

25-150 points per project can be earned by any group at the discretion of the Homecoming Steering Committee. Groups signing up for and completing an additional project will accumulate up to 50 extra points (not the listed value of the project).

Project lottery will occur at the General Meeting –Monday, September 29th.

Button Sales - Limited Supply

Groups may receive Championship Points for selling buttons. This year when **50** buttons (2 packages) are purchased by an organization, they will receive **25** points (25 buttons = 13 points). A maximum of 200 buttons or **100** points will be awarded. However, there will be no limit as to the number of buttons sold. Groups selling more than 200 buttons will be considered for additional **Spirit Points**. Buttons may be purchased in Career & Leadership Development, UC 146. Checks payable to UW-Whitewater.

Earning Spirit Points

Attitude

Groups showing Warhawk spirit, good sportsmanship and cooperation will be awarded spirit points.

Food Drive

Groups can earn up to 50 points for bringing non-perishable food items to the Dance, Monday, October 20th. Donations will be given to the Whitewater Food Pantry.

Supporting Warhawks

Groups visibly supporting Warhawk Athletic activities will be recognized with Spirit Points.

Window Painting Rules

Sunday, October 19

UC Windows

1. Participants will be designated a window at the University Center.
2. Paintings should be designed to promote the Homecoming theme. Taste and discretion should be used. The Homecoming Steering Committee has the right to determine what themes/drawings are appropriate to display on University windows. Participants should identify themselves somewhere on the design.
3. The entry form, a drawing of the design and a \$20.00 non-refundable entry fee for clean up of the windows, **MUST** be submitted to Career & Leadership Development by **4:00pm Friday, October 10th**. All drawings will be date stamped and the time of submission recorded. Drawings will not be returned. The Homecoming Steering Committee will review the drawings and advise participants of any designs that are similar in case you may wish to change them.
4. The paints used will be supplied by the Homecoming Steering Committee (White, Orange, Black, Red, Yellow, Green, Purple, Brown, Blue). **Paint will be applied over a white soap base (REQUIRED). Participants must supply their own brushes.**
5. Entrants can paint their respective window on Sunday October 19th from 12:00pm-6:00pm. Paint will not be available after 5:30pm. All painting materials and area must be cleaned by 6:00pm. Failure to clean up your area will result in a deduction of points. No professional artist or professional help of any kind will be allowed. **Participants must be current UW-Whitewater students who belong to the organization participating. A border of no less than 4 inches must be left around the design. Every participant will receive a 4 inch border to use. Groups not adhering to the border requirements or cleaning up their space by 7:00pm will be disqualified.**
6. Judging will take place throughout the day on Monday, October 20th.

Each Category will be judged on the above rating scale. Thus a total will be established for a winner in each division.

8. The decision of the judges is **FINAL**. The winner of each division will be announced and points will be awarded at the Dance. Points will be allocated to the winners as established in the points section.

NOTE: Any window painting promoting irresponsible use of alcohol, using profanity, or implying sexual or racial discrimination is not permitted. Such designs will be automatically disqualified and the window will be cleaned **IMMEDIATELY** by entrant upon notification from the Homecoming Steering Committee. Failure to do so will result in organization disqualification from **ALL** remaining Homecoming events.

1. Display boards are 36” high and 48” wide (similar to science fair boards used in high school).
2. **Display boards will be provided by the Homecoming Steering Committee through registration fees for this event.** All will be of the same quality of material and will be the color white and illustrated on one side only. No glitter will be allowed, and boards must fold closed completely
 - Groups will pay for the display board when picked up from the Homecoming Steering Committee.
3. The purpose of the display board is to describe who you are- your history, mission, members, how to join, and any other information.
4. One of the colors used on the display board must be purple.
5. The words "Warhawk" OR "Whitewater" must be used AND organization must be clearly identified.
6. No vulgarity, profanity, promoting of irresponsible use of alcohol, or implying sexual or racial discrimination will be permitted. Display boards violating this rule will be automatically disqualified.
7. Entry forms must be turned in to Career & Leadership Development (UC 146) by 4 pm, Friday, October 10. You are encouraged to submit your entries earlier.
8. Display Boards must be turned in to Career & Leadership Development, **DRY**, no later than **Monday, October 20th**, by 4:00 pm to qualify for judging.
9. Display designers and artists must be UW-Whitewater students.
10. Judging will take place throughout the day on Tuesday, October 21st.
11. Displays will be judged in the following areas:

A. Live Music Performance

*In the above category the majority of performance is live, no pre-recorded music will be allowed, except in the form of an instrumental accompaniment.

*No vocal/instrumental (live) music performances will be allowed in this category except for background music or as necessary to the plot of the skit.

C. Dance/Lip Sync

*Solo or Group

***No live narration**

*Emphasis on performing to recorded music

Each organization is limited to ONE act. The Homecoming Steering Committee reserves the right to classify each act as it sees fit.

The time limit for each act will be **FIVE** minutes. **Acts are limited to 20 performers and one stage manager (to coordinate the performance). Prop limitations will be discussed at the auditions.** The entries will be judged by a five-member committee consisting of UW-W faculty, staff, alums, and students. Judging is based on the following:

All entries will be required to submit a form to Career & Leadership Development, UC 146, by 4 pm Friday, October 10, and audition for the show. **Auditions will take place in UC 259 on Sunday, October 12 beginning at 10:00am, by appointment.**

At the audition, groups will need to perform their complete act once. (*Costumes and props are not required.*) **The Variety Show is limited to 20 acts. Groups will be dropped from the line-up for inappropriate acts, a lack of planning, or overall level of quality.**

Groups providing recorded music/accompaniment of any kind **must** submit it on one CD on **the day after the audition** October 13th by Noon (To UC 146). They will be converted for use in the show. **NO STOP/START OF SUPPLIED MUSIC WILL BE ALLOWED.**

All acts selected from the audition process will be required to PERFORM at the dress rehearsal on Sunday, October 19 at a scheduled time, in UC 259. Acts must be **performance ready** (props not required, costumes are required). All technical needs (lighting, sound, smoke machines) and a rough idea of the stage layout will be noted at this time. The dress rehearsal will be videotaped.

General Rules

1. Each organization entering shall complete a Game Roster Sheet. This will indicate the games in which they will participate.
2. Each organization participating in the games must pay a \$5 cover charge to cover the rental of equipment. This cover charge is due at the time you hand in the Participation Entry Form and the Games Roster Form on Friday, **October 10th** to Career & Leadership Development (UC 146) by 4 pm.
3. The Tug of War will be run and judged **in these categories (Men, Women, and Coed) only and will not be run in divisions.** (EXAMPLE: Men's Category would include -- All men's halls, social fraternities, and male only organizations.) All other games will run under normal divisions.
4. Groups may enter/participate in as few or as many games as they choose.
5. Members of groups not participating in a specific event must not be on or run through the playing field. Points will be deducted or the group will be disqualified from the game being run.

Good sportsmanship is expected and required.

Please be aware these games are physical activities, so be careful! HSC is not liable for any injuries incurred while participating in or viewing all games.

TUG OF WAR - ROPE BURN

1. Each team will consist of six members. One team per group. Coed teams shall have no more than three men.
2. **No spikes/cleats.** Any person wearing spikes (rubber or metal) will disqualify their team.
3. There will be an unlimited participant weight total.
4. No wrapping the rope around the wrist.
5. A single elimination tournament shall be held. Places in the brackets will be determined by an open draw.
6. No helping contestants in the way of touching the rope or the contestant is disqualified.
7. Gloves may be worn.
8. A scarf will be secured to the middle of a rope. Ten or more feet will separate the teams as marked. The scarf will start suspended in the middle of the gap, at a designated line. At the start signal, both teams will begin to try to pull the scarf to their side of the gap. Lines on the ground will determine the end of the gap. A time limit of ten minutes will be placed on each "pull."
9. The same team members must pull in all rounds with two alternates. Teams violating this rule will be disqualified. Team members will be marked during first round pull. **Must have 6 people to pull.**
10. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL.**

PYRAMID

1. Ten members per team. One team per group. Coed teams shall have no more than five men.
2. The pyramid is built for time only. Once built, you must hold it for ten seconds. There will be a ten yard running start.
3. Lowest level of pyramid must have hands and knees touching grass at all times.
4. One attempt per team.
5. Everyone must start standing straight up.
6. Gloves may be worn.
7. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL.**

General Rules

2. 1. The time capsule is a collection of pages created by UW-Whitewater groups. Each page is an archival quality, 8.5" x 11" sheet of paper, purchased from Career & Leadership Development (UC 146) when turning in the time capsule registration form.
2. Each page of the time capsule should represent the students of the Hall, Greek Organization or Student Organization. It may be a letter, drawing, picture or other 2-dimensional representation of the group. The focus of this activity is not as much on the individual homecoming theme, but on depicting the group creating the piece.
3. To receive full participation points and to be included in the Homecoming Time Capsule, the art must be flat - no 3-dimensional pieces allowed.
4. The hall or organization name must be clearly identified on the front side of the artwork.
5. No vulgarity, profanity, promoting of irresponsible use of alcohol, or implying sexual or racial discrimination will be permitted. Artwork violating this rule will be automatically disqualified.
6. Entry forms must be turned in to Career & Leadership Development (UC 146) by 4 pm, Friday, October 10. You are encouraged to submit your entries earlier.
7. Time Capsule Artwork must be turned in to Career & Leadership Development, **DRY**, no later than **Monday, October 20th**, by 4:00 pm to qualify for judging.
8. Time Capsule Artwork designers and artists must be current UW-Whitewater students.
9. Time Capsule Artwork will be evaluated in the following areas: Clarity of Description, Originality/Creativity, Adhering to Rules (1-5 above)
10. Judges will evaluate each group, awarding each up to 50 points. The judges' favorite from each division will be announced at the University Center 50th Anniversary and Time Capsule Dedication, held in the UC Concourse at 2:30pm, Friday, October 24th. An Ice Cream Social will be held for students, alumni, faculty and staff followed by a brief ceremony. Spirit points will be awarded for those attending the ceremony.
11. The decision of the judges is **FINAL**.

8. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL**.

NOTE: Any cheer promoting irresponsible use of alcohol, using profanity, or implying sexual or racial discrimination is not permitted. Any organizations using such cheers or displaying public drunkenness will be automatically disqualified and potentially banned from other homecoming activities.

1. Categories for all divisions are as follows: Float (pulled behind another vehicle) and Marching Units.
2. Car entries are encouraged but will NOT be judged.
3. A first place will be awarded in each division. The 50th year alumni favorite will be selected as the overall winner.
4. The proper parade unit entry form must be turned in to Career & Leadership Development (UC 146) **by 4 pm Friday, October 10th**. Additional forms are available at Career & Leadership Development, UC 146.
5. Professional help of any kind in the planning or construction of the float or marching unit will result in automatic disqualification.
6. No float may be higher than **12** feet.
7. Each float must be able to move forward at a rate of 5 mph.
8. Judging of floats will be done in these areas:

Overall Impression.....	15 pts.

10. Guidelines for parade participation of political groups and/or political candidates are as follows:
 - a. Completion and submission of the parade unit entry form by the required date, subject to the approval of the Homecoming Steering Committee and \$50 participation fee.
 - b. Sponsorship by a University (currently) recognized student organization **AND** completion of item (a) above.
 - c. Special invitation by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
11. The parade will start at **10:00 am**. All groups entering the competition **must** check-in at Carlson/CA Lot at their assigned time. **Late check-ins will result in a 15 point penalty.**
12. **Absolutely No Day Of Parade Entries!!!**
13. All units being judged in the parade must slow down (**but not stop**) while passing the judges' platform.
14. Entrants are **NOT PERMITTED TO HAVE ANY BEVERAGES**, alcoholic or non-alcoholic, at any time along the parade route. **Any entry promoting the use of alcohol, using profanity, vulgarity, sexually explicit material, or implying racial discrimination will be disqualified and removed from the parade and risk future ban from Homecoming activities.**
15. **No candy, gum, etc., may be THROWN from any floats or cars, only from walking parade participants.**
16. **Remember!!** Check-ins and line up for the parade will take place at the assigned times on Saturday, October 25. All entries should be lined up and ready to go at these assigned times.
17. Entries longer than 30 feet must give notification **PRIOR** to October 10th and be preapproved by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
18. Entries wishing to have any animals in the parade must notify the Homecoming Steering Committee prior to **October 10**, and have liability waivers and health certifications signed by owners.
19. The City of Whitewater Fire Department and the Homecoming Steering Committee request that you take precautions when using flammable materials in the construction of your float.

20. Decisions of the Judges are **FINAL**.
