Student and University Sponsored Organizations Requirements

In order to provide positive and safe involvement opportunities and for UW-Whitewater to provide support of that involvement, organizations are expected to meet the following requirements. After administrative review, organizations will then be granted University recognition and provided every privilege available. **Failure to meet any of these requirements will result in action on the part of the University, ranging from a warning to loss of University recognition.**

Anti-Hazing Agreement – Two officers will complete the web based Anti-Hazing seminar. All UW-W students will be expected to uphold University’s Anti-Hazing Policy.

Recognition – All Organizations will complete the Annual Renewal Process By May 15th annually. The annual renewal process requires all Student Organizations to submit: Constitution, Officer Contact information, Campus Advisor Signature verification, and have 2 members complete the Hazing Seminar.

Additionally, Greek Chapters must provide Proof of Insurance, maintain the web based Chapter Roster, and complete the Standards of Excellence process.

Alcohol/Drug Agreement – No illegal drug use nor underage alcohol consumption is permitted in connection with organization activities (in private residences, any other facility or event).

Financial Management - The Organization must be in good financial standing with the University.

Contracting – Organizations have no authority to enter into contracts on behalf of the University.

Local Laws and Ordinances- All organizations must be in compliance with local laws and ordinances.

Additional Specific Greek Requirements:

Affiliation - 100% of the new members must attend a University Sponsored new member orientation program called Greek 101.

National Status - Each existing and new Chapter must be affiliated, and in “good standing” with an Inter/National organization. Currently recognized local organizations are exempt.

Greek Standards Process - Each Chapter must complete the Greek Standards process annually. Failure to earn a “meets standard” ranking will result in possible probation, suspension, or revocation of University recognition of the Chapter.
