

Homecoming Champion's Trophy

One Champion's trophy will be awarded in each division (Greek, Student Organization, and Residence Hall). Points will be accumulated throughout Homecoming week by participating in events. The group in each division receiving the most points will be awarded the Champion's trophy at the football game on October 13th against UW-Oshkosh. **Champion's points are not applied to the Chancellor's Spirit Cup.**

The decision of the Homecoming Steering Committee is **FINAL**.

Chancellor's Spirit Cup

One Spirit Cup will be awarded in each division (Greek, Student Organization, Residence Hall). **Spirit Points are not applied to the Champion's trophies.** Homecoming Steering Committee members as well as designated campus employees will award spirit points.

Points will be distributed based on overall spirit, support of Homecoming, support of Warhawks, attendance during Homecoming Week activities, and assisting with community service. The group in each division receiving the most points will be awarded the Chancellor's Spirit Cup at the Football Game on October 13th. (See Page 7 for more hints.)

The decision of the Homecoming Steering Committee is **FINAL**.

The Homecoming Champion's Trophy and Chancellor's Spirit Cup are presented by the Chancellor and are designated as traveling trophies. Thus, the 2007 recipients of trophies and cups will be permitted to retain the trophy for display, recruitment, and/or other organizational purposes until **October 1, 2008**.

The Office of Residence Life has determined which activities residence halls will participate in (please see Residence Hall Participation Entry Form in the entry forms packet). Candidates **need not have any organization affiliation**, and do not serve as representatives of competing Championship Trophy organizations. **Please refer to Senior Awards Packet.**

Chalking

NO SPRAY CHALK IS ALLOWED.

Chalking is only allowed outside on horizontal surfaces that are exposed to the elements. Only sidewalk chalk may be used. Infractions that are corrected to the satisfaction of the Homecoming Steering Committee will not have points deducted. Defamation of others' chalkings is prohibited.

Body Paint Policy

Absolutely no masks of any kind will be allowed at the Dance on October 9th or at the Variety Show on October 10th. **However, face paint will be allowed from the neck up for all Homecoming week events.**

Licensing

*Participation points apply only to organizations who do not place in that event.

**Each group that auditions is awarded 25 points.

Additional points can be earned towards the Champion's Trophy by completing projects, selling buttons, attending general meetings and other activities. Points will be awarded as follows:

General Meeting Attendance

50 points per meeting. Each group must have at least two representatives and no more than five. Attendees must sign in.

Special Projects

25-150 points per project can be earned by any group at the discretion of the Homecoming Steering Committee. Groups signing up for and completing an additional project and complete it will accumulate 50 extra points (not the listed value of the project). **Project lottery will occur at the General Meeting –Monday, September 24th.**

Button Sales - Limited Supply

Groups may receive Championship Points for selling buttons. This year when **50** buttons (2 packages) are purchased by an organization, they will receive **25** points (25 buttons = 13 points). A maximum of 200 buttons or **100** points will be awarded. However, there will be no limit as to the number of buttons sold. Groups selling more than 200 buttons will be considered for additional **Spirit Points**. Buttons may be purchased in Leadership Development, Drumlin 120.

Checks are payable to UW-Whitewater.

Earning Spirit Points

Attitude

Groups showing Warhawk spirit, good sportsmanship and cooperation will be awarded spirit points.

Food Drive

Groups can earn up to 50 points for bringing non-perishable food items to the Dance, Tuesday, October 9. Donations will be given to the Whitewater Food Pantry.

Supporting Warhawks

Homecoming is about being and supporting all Warhawks. Groups visibly supporting Warhawk Athletic activities will be recognized with Spirit Points.

Banner Contest

Banners Due: Monday, October 8th by 8AM

Displayed in Whitewater Main Street Businesses

1. Maximum banner size is 4 feet wide by 3 feet tall. BANNERS MUST BE PAINTED WIDE, NOT LONG.



2. **Banners must be made of cloth provided by the Homecoming Steering Committee.** All cloth will be of the same quality of material and will be the color white and illustrated on one side only. **HSC will provide paint, however, entrants must provide brushes and any other materials used to create the banner.** No glitter will be allowed.

- Groups will pay for the cloth when picked up from the Homecoming Steering Committee.

3. One of the colors used on the banner must be purple.
4. The cheer or slogan written on the banner must use the words "Warhawk" OR "Whitewater" AND have organization identification.
5. No vulgarity, profanity, promoting of irresponsible use of alcohol, or implying sexual or racial discrimination will be permitted. Banners violating this rule will be automatically disqualified.
6. Entry forms must be turned in to Leadership Development (Drumlin 120) by 4 pm, Friday, September 28. You are encouraged to submit your entries earlier.
7. Banners must be turned in to Leadership Development, **DRY**, no later than **Monday, October 8**, by **8:00 AM** to qualify for judging.

8. Banners will be judged in the following areas:

Adhering to Homecoming Theme.....	30 pts.
Originality/Creativity.....	30 pts.
Overall Impression.....	25 pts.
Adhering to Rules (1-4 above).....	<u>15 pts.</u>
Total	100 pts.

9. Banner designers/artists must be UW-W students.
10. The decision of the judges is **FINAL**. **Judging: Monday, October 8th at 9AM, Whitewater Armory.**
11. Students may vote on their favorite Banner in each division by going to the Homecoming Website. Each student will only be allowed to vote once and the points will count for the weight of one's judges' score in the overall points. **Voting will take place beginning Tuesday, October 9 and will end on Thursday, October 11 at 4PM.** Winners will be shown and announced at the Spirit Rally.

Categories

A. Live Music Performance

*Solo or Group

*In the above category the majority of performance is live, no pre-recorded music will be allowed, except in the form of an instrumental accompaniment.

B. Novelty/Skit

*Comedy, Magic, Drama, etc.

*No vocal/instrumental (live) music performances will be allowed in this category except for background music or as necessary to the plot of the skit.

C. Dance/Lip Sync

*Solo or Group

***No live narration**

*Emphasis on performing to recorded music

Each organization is limited to ONE act. The Homecoming Steering Committee reserves the right to classify each act as it sees fit.

The time limit for each act will be **FIVE** minutes. **Acts are limited to 20 performers and one stage manager (to coordinate the performance). Prop limitations will be discussed at the auditions.** The entries will be judged by a five-member committee consisting of UW-W faculty, staff, alums, and students. Judging is based on the following:

(VARIETY SHOW RULES, CONTINUED)

All entries will be required to submit a form to Leadership Development, Drumlin 120, by 4 pm Friday, September 28, and audition for the show. **Auditions will take place in Esker 108 on Sunday, September 30 at 12 Noon.**

At the audition, groups will need to perform their complete act once. (*Costumes and props are not required.*) **The Variety Show is limited to 20 acts. Groups will be dropped from the line-up for inappropriate acts, a lack of planning, or overall level of quality.**

Groups providing recorded music/accompaniment of any kind **must** submit it on one CD or 60 minute cassette on **the day after the audition** October 1st by Noon(CD's are preferred). They will be converted for the use in the show. **NO STOP/START OF SUPPLIED MUSIC WILL BE ALLOWED.**

All acts selected from the audition process will be required to PERFORM at the dress rehearsal on Sunday, October 7 at 12 Noon, at the Whitewater Armory. Acts must be **performance ready** (props not required, costumes are required). All technical needs (lighting, sound, smoke machines) and a rough idea of the stage layout will be noted at this time. The dress rehearsal will be videotaped.

****Mandatory Audition & Dress Rehearsal****

(Failure to perform at either will result in disqualification.)

(Groups altering acts will result in disqualification & will be escorted out)

(Costumes are subject to HSC approval)

Guidelines:

- Costumes are subject to approval by HSC.
- Any act promoting irresponsible use of alcohol, using profanity, or implying sexual or racial discrimination will be automatically disqualified.
- **Public drunkenness will result in point deductions and/or or group disqualification.**
- Tickets: \$3.00 w/ID and no button
 Free w/button and ID
- Only those participating in an act will have access to backstage area.
- Ticket Lottery will be held October 1 at the General Meeting. Organizations will be limited to 60 tickets in the initial lottery. Groups must pick up their tickets by Noon, Thursday, October 4th from the Ticket Center in the CA.

Entries must be checked in by **6:50 pm**. Failure to check-in on time or no show will result in removal from competition and a 20 pt. overall deduction.

1. "Yell Like Hell" will be held during the Spirit Rally.
2. Each group will perform a cheer of its choice in the designated area.
3. **Each organization is limited to 60 seconds or one (1) minute for its presentation. A 15 point deduction will be made to any entry going over the time limit. Timing begins when choreographed movement begins.**
4. **Submit cheer, typed, by Monday, October 8th at 8AM** to Leadership Development (Drumlin 120). Must include list of props to be used (i.e. signs, instruments, etc.)
5. Order of performance will be displayed online on the Homecoming website.
6. The faculty/staff will judge using a point system of 1-10 for spirit, volume, clarity, originality, organization, crowd response, adherence to theme, and time limit.
7. All participants should assemble at Gym 4 of the DLK Fieldhouse at the beginning of the Spirit Rally and check in with **David Hanschke or Jenn Nohr.**
8. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL.**

NOTE: Any cheer promoting irresponsible use of alcohol, using profanity, or implying sexual or racial discrimination is not permitted. Any organizations using such cheers or displaying public drunkenness will be automatically disqualified and potentially banned from other homecoming activities.

General Rules

1. Each organization entering shall complete a Game Roster Sheet. This will indicate the games in which they will participate.
2. Each organization participating in the games must pay a \$5 cover charge to cover the rental of equipment. This cover charge is due at the time you hand in the Participation Entry Form and the Games Roster Form on Friday, **September 28th** to Leadership Development (Drumlin 120) by 4 pm.
3. The Tug of War will be run and judged **in these categories (Men, Women, and Coed) only and will not be run in divisions.** (EXAMPLE: Men's Category would include – All men's halls, social fraternities, and male only organizations.) All other games will run under normal divisions.
4. Groups may enter/participate in as few or as many games as they choose.
5. Members of groups not participating in a specific event must not be on or run through the playing field. Points will be deducted or the group will be disqualified from the game being run.

Good sportsmanship is expected and required.

Please be aware these games are physical activities, so be careful! HSC is not liable for any injuries incurred while participating in or viewing all games.

WARHAWK BRAINIACS CHALLENGE

General Rules:

1. **Time:** Pick up Warhawk Brainiacs Challenge (WBC) on Wednesday, October 10 between 1:00PM - 6:00PM at Leadership Development. **Packet is due on Friday, October 12 at the Games (by Perkins Stadium) by 2:05PM.**
2. 100 questions
3. 1 point each
4. **MUST** be typed.
5. Either right or all wrong (NO half points)
6. HSC encourages use of Faculty/Staff
 - a. **NO** use of Homecoming Steering Committee member, SEAL, Warhawk Ambassador, or Leadership Development staff is permitted.
7. Part of GAMES score.
8. Top 3 in each division will be announced and displayed at Spirit Rally (Greeks, Residence Halls and Student Organizations)

HARD CORE OBSTACLE COURSE

1. 4 people needed, does need to be coed
2. 4 obstacle courses in the event
3. Obstacle course is a timed event
4. Optional: knee pads, elbow pads, gloves.
5. Must wear tennis shoes

TUG OF WAR - ROPE BURN

1. Each team will consist of six members. One team per group. Coed teams shall have no more than three men.
2. **No spikes/cleats.** Any person wearing spikes (rubber or metal) will disqualify their team.
3. There will be an unlimited participant weight total.
4. No wrapping the rope around the wrist.
5. A single elimination tournament shall be held. Places in the brackets will be determined by an open draw.
6. No helping contestants in the way of touching the rope or the contestant is disqualified.
7. Gloves may be worn.
8. A scarf will be secured to the middle of a rope. Ten or more feet will separate the teams as marked. The scarf will start suspended in the middle of the gap, at a designated line. At the start signal, both teams will begin to try to pull the scarf to their side of the gap. Lines on the ground will determine the end of the gap. A time limit of ten minutes will be placed on each "pull."
9. The same team members must pull in all rounds with two alternates. Teams violating this rule will be disqualified. Team members will be marked during first round pull. **Must have 6 people to pull.**
10. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL.**

PYRAMID

1. Ten members per team. One team per group. Coed teams shall have no more than five men.
2. The pyramid is built for time only. Once built, you must hold it for ten seconds. There will be a ten yard running start.
3. Lowest level of pyramid must have hands and knees touching grass at all times.
4. One attempt per team.
5. Everyone must start standing straight up.
6. Gloves may be worn.
7. Decisions by the judges are **FINAL.**

1. Categories for all divisions are as follows: Float (pulled behind another vehicle) and Marching Units.
2. Car entries are encouraged but will NOT be judged.
3. A first place will be awarded in each division. There will not be an overall winner awarded.
4. The proper parade unit entry form must be turned in to Leadership Development (Drumlin 120), on **Friday, September 28th, by 4 pm**. Additional forms are available at Leadership Development, Drumlin 120.
5. Professional help of any kind in the planning or construction of the float or marching unit will result in automatic disqualification.
6. No float may be higher than **12** feet.
7. Each float must be able to move forward at a rate of 5 mph.
8. Judging of floats will be done in these areas:

Adhering to Homecoming Theme	35 pts.
Workmanship	25 pts.
Originality.....	20 pts.
Overall Impression	15 pts.
Use of Color	<u>5 pts.</u>
Total	100 pts.

9. Judging of marching units will be done in these areas:

Adhering to Homecoming Theme	40 pts.
Originality.....	20 pts.
Overall Impression	20 pts.
Unity	<u>20 pts.</u>
Total	100 pts.

10. Guidelines for parade participation of political groups and/or political candidates are as follows:
 - a. Completion and submission of the parade unit entry form by the required date, subject to the approval of the Homecoming Steering Committee and \$50 participation fee.
 - b. Sponsorship by a University (currently) recognized student organization **AND** completion of item (a) above.
 - c. Special invitation by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
11. The parade will start at **10:00 am**. All groups entering the competition **must** check-in at Carlson/CA Lot at their assigned time. **Late check-ins will result in a 15 point penalty.**
12. **Absolutely No Day Of Parade Entries!!!**
13. All units being judged in the parade must slow down (**but not stop**) while passing the judges' platform and maintain a 50 yard distance.
14. Entrants are **NOT PERMITTED TO HAVE ANY BEVERAGES**, alcoholic or non-alcoholic, at any time along the parade route. **Any entry promoting the use of alcohol, using profanity, vulgarity, sexually explicit material, or implying racial discrimination will be disqualified and removed from the parade and risk future ban from Homecoming activities.**
15. **No candy, gum, etc., may be THROWN from any floats or cars, only from walking parade participants.**
16. **Remember!!** Check-ins and line up for the parade will take place at the assigned times on Saturday, October 13. All entries should be lined up and ready to go at these assigned times.
17. Entries longer than 30 feet must give notification **PRIOR** to September 28th and be approved by the Homecoming Steering Committee in advance.
18. Entries wishing to use animals must notify the Homecoming Steering Committee prior to **September 28th**, and have liability waivers and health certifications signed by owners.
19. The City of Whitewater Fire Department and the Homecoming Steering Committee request that you take precautions when using flammable materials in the construction of your float. **(Sources of non-flammable float decoration are available at Leadership Development, Drumlin 120.)**
20. Decisions of the Judges are **FINAL**.
