On Tuesday, October 13, 2009, faculty members who have created and are using digital stories will present their own stories and talk about the application in their classes.

The workshop will be led by Jim Winship, Professor of Social Work. Dr. Winship is a professional storyteller and is certified as a facilitator by the Center for Digital Storytelling.
