Goals

Objectives

- Provide classroom instruction in academic areas
- Introduce students to skill-building technology in math and science
- Experience career options through hands-on activities
- Interact with college faculty and students

Activities

- Participate in personal and professional workshops and seminars
- Engage in classroom instruction for a better understanding of oral, written, and listening communication
- Visit area businesses and laboratories
- Engage in collaborative work efforts and group presentations



Eligibility

Students are required to complete the application process. Priority consideration is given to student participants based upon the date a completed application is received.

Due to eligibility changes within the Department of Public Instruction, all applicants must be eligible for "free and reduced" lunch and a Wisconsin resident to receive the DPI scholarship, which is the full payment for camp.

The Office of Pre-College Programs offers camps for students in the 6th through 12th grades, except for the ACT Camp, which is for students entering 10th, 11th and 12th grades; and Gear Up Camp, which is for students at targeted schools entering 6th, 7th and 8th grades.

Students entering the 12th grade in the Fall 2009 must have a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Cost

The Pre-College Summer Camps are funded by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and UW-Whitewater.

Application Process

- Complete Department of Public Instruction application, including a copy of most recent grades, as well as a Pre-College Summer Camps application package.
- Attend a parent orientation.
- Present official acceptance letter at check-in.

Educational Talent Search Program

Serves students from grades 6-12 in targeted schools in Beloit and Milwaukee providing students with: college and career orientation activities; college visitation, after school tutorial support and summer enrichment experiences.

Upward Bound Program

Serves college-bound students in grades 9-12 at targeted schools in Milwaukee and Racine. Support is provided through academic advising, tutoring, mentoring, and a six-week summer academic enrichment experience.
