**SOCIOLGY 240 INTRODUCTORY SOCIOLOGY ...** *This course will introduce students to the ways in which sociologists use social theory and research methods to study human group behavior and the processes by which people build, maintain, and change their social relationships with others and the broader society in which they live. The course will enhance students' sociological imagination in four general areas of sociological inquiry: social structure, interaction, and change; inequality and diversity; family, health, and environment; and crime, criminal justice, and law.*

Questions raised include whether American society should attempt to minimize differences between minorities and the majority, whether to blend or maintain group identities, and how we should address existing barriers and inequalities. Relationships and differences among minority groups will also be examined.*
