Therese Kennedy, Recreation Sports presented information about options and opportunities available for staff through recreational sports and at the Williams Center. Check out their website: http://www.uww.edu/staffair/recsport/ for more information.

Interesting facts you may not know:

- 1. Staff members are automatically considered "silver" members. This means they have access to the pool, field house, racquetball and indoor tennis courts during the open times (usually 7-9 a.m., 11 a.m. 1 p.m., and 7-9 p.m. weekdays—see website or call for weekend hours).
- 2. A fitness membership may be purchased for "gold" membership status to use weight room, University Fitness Center and attend group classes.
- 3. Personal Trainers are available to those with Fitness Center passes for an additional charge.
- 4. Group classes can be attended singly without preregistration. Classes are free with fitness membership or a punch pass can be purchased for \$40/semester.
- 5. Additional family members can join at the Fitness Membership price. Children under 18 only allowed to join in Summer (ages 15-18 only).
- 6. Staff can join intramural sports teams or competitions.

Lisa Rowland, iCIT presented the following upcoming software changes expected to occur within the next twelve months:

<u>Internet Explorer 7.1</u> deployment is expected in February of 2007. It is currently blocked from automatically updating until iCIT has determined that it is compatible with campus software.

Main differences from old IE

- Icons instead of menu bar
- Tabbed browsing
- Instant search

<u>Exchange 2007 (e-mail server software)</u> – deployment summer 2007 in preparation for Outlook 2007 and for improved features in OWA

Outlook 2007 (e-mail)

Advantages:

- Better/more OWA (program for use of e-mail off campus https://post.uww.edu)
- More out of office options

Office 2007 deployment expected Spring 2008 Challenges:

- Different enough that attending a training session is highly recommended. May want to come back for a second training after using too.
- Documents don't convert to mac's, \$20 kit available should be Microsoft does not yet have a conversion pack for Macs however, there is a third party conversion pack available through a third-party vender for \$20.
- new document extensions which means document must be converted back into .doc format for those without Office 2007.
- Buttons and icons instead of menu bar or "classic" view

Advantages:

- More spellcheck capability
- Language translator
- Better graphics
- Attachments can be previewed before opening
- Can "pin" a file to recently viewed documents list
- New document extensions mean smaller documents to attach to e-mails

<u>Vista (new operating system to replace Windows)</u> – deployment expected to start Spring 2008 earliest. Will not be deployed campus wide but by attrition as new computers are purchased.

Main advantages:

- Security
- allows recovery of files saved and then overwritten
