Occupational Therapy

What is occupational therapy? Occupational therapists help people with injuries retrain for work. They also help people with disabilities to perform daily tasks of life.

What do I need to apply for admission to an OT school? There are several paths for entry:

- a) Associate degree (or general liberal arts courses for 2 years), followed by two years in OT bachelor's program;
- b) Four-years in OT bachelor's degree program; or
- c) Certificate or MS in OT after bachelor's in another area.
- d) Combined BS/MS program.

Does UWW have an OT program? No, UWW does not have an OT training program, and we do not offer a degree called 'pre-occupational therapy". You could study the bare minimum of courses to apply to an OT school, but you probably would not get in – entry is competitive, and if you did not get in at that point, you also would not have a college degree, or a back-up plan.

Can UWW help me prepare for an accredited OT school? Absolutely! We offer all the courses required for entry into an OT program, which fit well with requirements for majors in biology, psychology, or sociology and the required and elective General Education courses.

- 1. Undergraduate degree (BS or BA): Most OT schools require students to earn a college or university degree (BS or BA; school may prefer one or other). Some graduate OT programs may have articulation agreements with undergraduate schools.
- 2. Major and minor: Typical fields of study include biology, psychology, and sociology.
- **3. Coursework:** OT schools expect applicants to complete certain classes:

4. Exposure to occupational therapy: Students are expected to have experience with what work is involved. This can be completed by job shadowing, observation, paid or volunteer work. The amount of time and type of setting(s) varies by school.

5. Entrance exam: Students may be required to take the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) at some schools.

What happens then? After your professional education, you would receive a masters (MS) degree in occupational therapy. You would also need to take the appropriate licensure exams. The school you attend will help you prepare.
