GUIDELINES ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-WHITEWATER 2015-2016

The purpose of the Advanced Opportunity Program (AOP) is to expand the number of minority/disadvantaged students who receive graduate degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. Individuals who are residents of the State of Wisconsin and members of an ethnic minority group which traditionally have been under-represented in the advanced levels of major fields of study offered at UW-Whitewater are given highest priority for receiving AOP awards. The University is committed to recruitment, support, retention and graduation of AOP recipients. AOP awards are offered subject to availability of funds.

A. ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be:

- 1. U.S. Citizen or permanent resident at the time of application.
- 2. Members of traditionally under-represented minority groups (African American, Hispanic, American Indian/Alaskan Native or statutorily designated Southeast Asian) or non-minority/disadvantaged students.

Students are considered disadvantaged if they meet any of the criteria including but not limited to one or more of the following:

- a) Have a financial need;
- b) come from a family that receive any type of public assistance, including eligibility for school lunch program;
- c) Are first generation college students;
- d) Have participated in special services for disadvantaged students including TRIO programs such as Student Support Services, McNair Scholars Program, Upward Bound, Talent Search, etc.; and/or have not had the expectation and encouragement to pursue post graduate education as a viable option.
- 3. Admitted to a graduate degree program at UW-Whitewater.
- 4. Registered for classes at UW-Whitewater

B. PROCEDURES FOR APPLYING

To apply for an award, applicants must:

- 1. Submit two letters of reference from faculty/staff members knowledgeable about their academic potential.
- 2. Submit a 1 page Personal Goal Statement.
- 3. Request and return a completed AOP application to the Office of the Assistant Vice Chancellor for Multicultural Affairs & Student Success.

New Applicants must also:

1. Apply for admission to a degree program by completing the Graduate Application for Admission form, submitting the \$56 fee and arranging for having their official post secondary transcripts forwarded to the Graduate Office.

C. APPLICATION DEADLINE

Completed applications are due by March 27, 2015 for priority consideration.

D. SELECTION:

The selection of recipients among eligible applicants is based upon the following priorities:

- 1. Continuing UW-Whitewater students previously awarded an unconditional AOP award.
- Students enrolling in graduate studies at UW-Whitewater for the first time who have not previously attained a master's degree.
- 3. Continuing UW-Whitewater graduate students not previously selected as an AOP award recipient.
- 4. Demonstrated Financial Need.

Among applicants within each of the three groups above, priority will be given as follows:

- 1. Wisconsin residents who have met the **March 27, 2015** deadline.
- 2. Non-residents who have met the **March 27, 2015** deadline
- 3. Wisconsin residents & non-residents who have not met the March 27, 2015 deadline.

The following criteria will be used to rank applicants:

- 1. Application Date.
- 2. Admission to graduate school.

E. TERMS FOR THE ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM ASSISTANTSHIPS:

- 1. The maximum AOP award for the 2015-16 academic year is \$10,000.00 (based on graduate program). All recipients must pay the in-state fee. A non-resident fee remission is available to out-of-state AOP recipients. AOP award recipients are allowed to participate in assistantships and other department funded programs. Awards are contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Wisconsin State Legislature.
- 2. AOP award recipients are expected to pursue and meet the graduate academic requirements of the University. The credit load and the award may be modified pending circumstances and availability of funds.
- 3. All AOP recipients will be reviewed at the end of each semester by the AOP Committee. A 3.00 cumulative grade point average must be maintained and/or recipient must be meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements.
- 4. Summer awards are not guaranteed. Specific summer selection criteria are announced each year depending on the availability of funds.
- 5. Please be advised given the cost differential, AOP funds are not available for online courses. AOP funds will only pay the standard tuition and fees. Students are responsible for the difference.
- 6. AOP is available for **tuition ONLY**.
- 7. AOP Recipients are expected to notify the selection committee if receiving tuition reimbursement or other sources of funding for tuition.
- 8. AOP funding is limited to a maximum of 8 full-time equivalent semesters.
- 9. *Proof of submission of Federal Application for Financial Student Aid (FAFSA) must be done to be considered for AOP funding.

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Applicants will be notified by July 1, 2015. (Or when tuition is set for 2015-2016).
