

Distance Education Fee Committee Meeting
November 3, 2010
11:00 a.m. to Noon

Present: Ellyn Dickmann, chair; Bill Skelly; Shannon Stuart; Eileen Schroeder; Sang Choi; Pat Casey; David Van Doren and Stan Smoniewski.

We need a definition from UW System for *Hybrid Courses*. Ellyn will get “definitions” of hybrid and on-line from the Registrar’s Office also. Aimee McCann said a fee could be charged only if the course is 100% on-line per UW System. Ellyn will get clarification on this. Sloan and Company defines Hybrid as being 30% to 79% on-line. Less than 30% is defined as on-line.

If a course is on-line, no out of state tuition is charged to the student taking the class. Students are paying a “segregated fee” for using facilities and the library. If the course is all on-line, students don’t use a facility but still pay the segregated fee.

It was noted that group work in on-line and face-to-face courses are totally different.

Are there restrictions on hybrid courses taught off-campus by instructors from UW-Whitewater?

Sang discussed the need for fees to be used for professional development and how safety classes in his department may fit within this fee structure.
