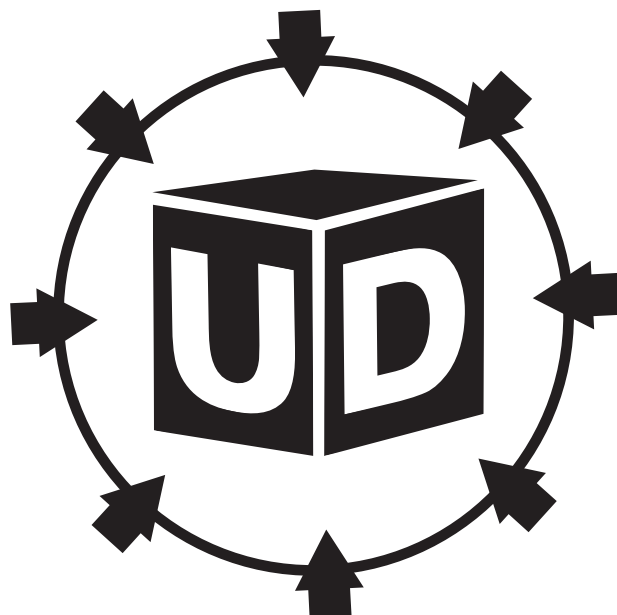


# ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES:
