This workshop focuses on the already overburdened university instructor/professor who would like for his/her students to improve their writing skills without adding to the instructor's grading or research workload. Simple non-invasive instructional techniques and methods will be discussed and described for helping students to improve their writing skills by tweaking current assignments, utilizing D2L, Turnitin, and Twitter, and empowering students to become active learners who will *think* before they write. Technological and non-technological teaching methodologies and best practices will be included in this workshop format.


