
As you prepare for your appointments with your advisor throughout this year, make sure that you log into WINS and print out this document to bring to each appointment.

Family Fest is a time for students, faculty, and staff to host loved ones on campus and enjoy all that the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater has to offer.




