





Fall New Freshman Class Admit and Yield Rates





Geographic Origin of New Freshman Class, Fall 2023 Whitewater Class






Whitewater Campus - by Wisconsin County



Geographic Origin of New Freshman Class, Fall 2023 Rock County Campus




Geographic Origin of New Transfer Class, Fall 2023 Whitewater Campus


Geographic Origin of New Transfer Class, Fall 2023 Rock County Campus






Historical Fall Enrollment by Campus




Historical Fall Enrollment by Student Level




Historical Spring Enrollment by Student Level



Historical Summer Enrollment by Student Level




Historical Winterim Enrollment by Student Level











AVERAGE AGE BY STUDENT LEVEL




PERCENTAGE OF NONTRADITIONAL (AGE 25+) UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS BY CAMPUS






Geographic Origin of Undergraduate Students from the United States, Fall 2023 Whitewater Campus



Geographic Origin of Undergraduate Students from the United States, Fall 2023 Rock County Campus




Geographic Origin of Undergraduate Non-Domestic Students, Fall 2023 Whitewater Campus




Geographic Origin of Undergraduate Non-Domestic Students, Fall 2023 Rock County Campus





FIRST-TO-SECOND YEAR RETENTION RATE OF FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME STUDENTS




SIX-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY COLLEGE





SIX-YEAR GRADUATION RATE OF FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME URM STUDENTS





NSSE HIPs - FRESHMAN PARTICIPATION




NSSE HIPs - SENIOR PARTICIPATION






PERCENTAGE OF DEGREES AWARDED TO WOMEN







FACULTY HEADCOUNT BY COLLEGE



TREND IN FULL-TIME/PART-TIME STATUS OF EMPLOYEES



2023 FACULTY AND STAFF FTE SOURCE OF FUNDING





Note: The student-to-faculty ratio at UW-Whitewater is calculated using a formula provided by the Common Data Set (CDS) Initiative. This formula is favored because it takes into account both full-time and part-time student counts, both full-time and part-time faculty and instructional academic staff (IAS) counts, and the percentage of faculty and IAS who have predominately instructional responsibilities. U.S. News and World Report also requires colleges to use the CDS formula when submitting student-to-faculty ratios for its college rankings issue. The formula is as follows:

Student-to-Faculty Ratio = [FT Students + (PT Students/3)] / [FT Faculty and IAS + (PT Faculty and IAS/3)]

Values are shown in reverse order on the line graph since a lower ratio indicates a smaller number of students per each faculty member, indicating smaller class sizes and more individualized attention.
