Time and Credits to Degree University of Wisconsin-Whitewater Bachelor Degree Recipients Entering as First-time, Full-time

Introduction

The Time and Credits to degree reports analyze the undergraduate activity of students who entered the institution as a new freshman and received their first bachelor's degree at UW-Whitewater. All analysis is based on data submitted as part of the UW System Central Data Request (CDR). Credit activity in the CDR is limited to academic credits awarded through courses offered by UW departments. Credits earned through placement (such as AP), credits for prior learning, or transfer credits are not included in the CDR.

In this report, we cover time and credits to degree is broken down by college, single/double degree¹, number of major changes, and three-year average by college and degree type. We also cover time to degree by college and major, and credits to degree by college and major.

The Universities of Wisconsin publishes undergraduate time and credits to degree data at the campus level on the UWSA Accountability Dashboard; however, details at the major level are not available.

What is time to degree?

Time to degree is the amount of time that elapses between the beginning of a student's first term enrolled at UW-Whitewater as a first-time, full-time undergraduate and the end of the term when that student earns a UW-Whitewater bachelor's degree, expressed in both average number of enrolled terms and years. To arrive at an average time to degree for a given major, we combine the time to degree for all students who earned a degree with that particular major (regardless of any other majors they may have earned, or any other majors they may have been enrolled in at some point during their undergraduate studies), and report the average².

What influences time to degree?

Time to degree depends on the characteristics of students entering UW-Whitewater as well as their academic careers once they declare a major. Contributing factors include:

• When do students enter a major? Do students in a given major typically begin their college careers already planning and preparing for that major, or do they tend to declare that major later in their careers when they may need to catch up on requirements?

¹ Double degree refers to students who received two bachelor's degrees at the same institution in the same term.

² For example, if a student earned a B.A. with majors in psychology and sociology, that student's full time to degree will count in both psychology and sociology. We do not currently separate students who graduated with one major versus those who graduated with more than one major.

- How many transfer, placement, and test credits do students bring to a major? Although we only report on the credits attempted at UW-Whitewater, students do bring in credits from outside of UW-Whitewater through placement exams (such as AP) and transfer credits from other institutions, which can impact how many credits are attempted at UW-Whitewater.
- How many students in a major also have a second (or third) major? We may see that students with multiple majors have longer Time and Credits to Degree because of added requirements.
- Other factors at the student level:
 - Are students enrolled **part-time or full-time**? We report Time and Credits to Degree only for students who start as full-time students, but they may not be enrolled full-time every term.
 - Did students need to retake required courses?
- Other factors the department may be able to influence:
 - **Course offerings:** Does demand for required courses exceed the supply of seats? Are required courses available during summer term?
 - Degree planning: Are students meeting with their advisers early in their careers and making plans to meet all degree requirements within four years?

Calculating Average Number of Enrolled Terms

Average number of terms enrolled is calculated based on the number of fall and spring terms enrolled at UW-Whitewater only by students starting as new freshmen at the institution.

This calculation demonstrates the actual number of terms a student was enrolled.

To establish perspective, note the following examples:

1) A student who was enrolled for all Fall and Spring terms for 4 years:

Fall 2019 = 1 term, Spring 2020 = 1 term Fall 2020= 1 term, Spring 2021 = 1 term Fall 2021 = 1 term, Spring 2022 = 1 term Fall 2022 = 1 term, Spring 2023 = 1 term Enrolled Terms to Degree = 8 terms

Calculating Average Enrolled Years to Degree

Average enrolled years to degree is calculated based on the number of fall and spring terms, which is summed and then divided by 2. This calculation can be used by prospective students to determine how long it typically takes to complete a degree in a major (if full-time status is maintained). The figure demonstrates how many academic years a student was enrolled by counting fall and spring terms as half of a year (enrollment during the summer is not included in this calculation).

- For example, a student who was enrolled for all Fall and Spring terms for 4 years would have been enrolled for 4.0 years.
- Additionally, a student who was enrolled for all Fall, Spring, and Summer terms for 4 years also would have been enrolled for 4.0 years.

Calculating Average Credits to Degree Attempted

Credits to Degree Attempted represents the number of credits attempted by a student during the course of their academic career in pursuit of a specific degree. Credit activity is limited to academic credits awarded through courses offered by UW departments. Credits earned through placement (such as AP), credits for prior learning, or transfer credits are not presented in the reports.

Definitions

- Number of Degrees Earned: The number of degrees listed in that degree, college, and/or major, but should not be used for calculating total number of degrees conferred. Please see Degrees Awarded on the IRAP Website.
- Average GPA: The cumulative GPA of degree recipients from the time of their degree conferral (data source: CDR data/UW System)
- Avg Credits to Degree at UWW: Credit activity limited to academic credits awarded through courses offered by UWW departments (data source: CDR data/UW System). This figure represents the credits attempted at UWW by the student, and may be less than the total required credits of the major.
- Avg. No. of Fall & Spring Terms Attended: The average number of fall and spring terms in which students were enrolled at UW-Whitewater. This calculation only includes students who started at UW-Whitewater as new freshmen.
- Avg. Enrolled Years to Graduation: Calculated based on the number of fall and spring terms, which is summed then divided by 2. The value represents the number of academic years a student is enrolled in by counting fall and spring terms as half of a year and summer is not factored in.
