OVERVIEW

At the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, academic success is our number-one priority. Our Pathway for Success program is evidence of our commitment to the academic achievement of students. As you transition into the university environment, this program will provide you with supplemental support and cultivate an environment wherein preparation and maximum effort are your superior standard during your critical first year.

Our faculty and staff are truly devoted to advocating for students and motivating them to take full advantage of their learning experience, including establishing a robust academic foundation. In essence, they trust in the power of the process of learning. Our faculty and staff know that intelligence and talent can be fostered — they are not fixed resources, but rather flexible.

As a Pathway for Success student, you will be advised by Pathway for Success advisors in the Academic Advising & Exploration Center (AAEC) for your first two semesters. Advisors will challenge and support you by applying proactive advising strategies throughout various and deliberate contact points that take place at vital junctures in the academic year — such as the first three weeks of the semester, at midterms and before registration. Advisors will encourage you to develop self-responsibility and establish individual educational goals based on your personal values, interests and abilities. You will also benefit from intentional interactions with your advisor via individual and group meetings, classroom presentations and Pathway for Success-sponsored events.

PROGRAM CRITERIA

Required participation in the Pathway for Success program is determined by a committee review of a student's previous overall academic record at the time of admission to UW-Whitewater. Components of a student's academic record taken into consideration include (but are not limited to) high school GPA, standardized test scores, rigor of coursework, grade trends, personal statement, activities, etc. Based on this comprehensive review, you are one of the 125 to 150 students selected to benefit from Pathway for Success each year.



PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS

As a student in Pathway for Success, you will:

- Enroll in pre-determined courses for two semesters. Courses are held Monday through Friday.
- Attend 3-4 hours of evening Supplemental Instruction (SI) each week.
- Limit your enrollment to a maximum of 15 units in each of two semesters.
- Meet one-on-one with your academic advisor three times per semester.
- Participate in sponsored events that focus on academic success, experiential learning, service learning and student development.

REQUIRED COURSEWORK

All students in the program take 8-15 units of Pathway for Success-supported courses, including student success courses, New Student Seminar, communication and calculation courses (English and math), and basic general education courses.

ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE

A key component available to Pathway for Success students is Supplemental Instruction (SI), which are group tutoring sessions linked to students' required courses. You will have access to math study groups, in-class and individual tutoring, cyber tutoring, and more, provided at no extra charge by Campus Tutorial Services.
