2022 IN REVIEW – HIGHLIGHTS:

- We welcomed many new officers to our team in 2022. Officer Aldrich, Officer Stuppy, K9 Tilla, Officer Olson and Officer Feucht have all been positive additions to the department.
- With the addition of K9 Tilla, our K9 Unit has expanded to now include the abilities of apprehension, tracking and drug detection. We were thankful to receive generous donations to our K9 program from LETTSEW K9 Foundation and UWW SUFAC in 2022.
- Chief Kiederlen was selected to be a speaker at an international conference (International Association of Chiefs of Police/IACP).
- Department personnel participated in many trainings to gain new skills or enhance existing skills, in areas such as: firearms instruction, crisis intervention, emergency medical care for K9s in the field, emergency vehicle operations, parking management software, compassionate policing, and many others!
- UWWPD conducted/attended joint trainings and exercises with many other local agencies to expand relationships and response capabilities to larger scale incidents, including: active shooter, mobile field force (crowd control tactics), emergency management exercises with county emergency managers, and many others!



Safety Tips for 2023:

1. **Lock up!** Make it a habit to close and lock windows and doors in your residence halls and apartments.
2. **Take precautions after dark.** Have a friend come with you after dark, or call UWWPD for an escort if you are on campus.
3. **Pay attention to what you are posting on social media.** Are your posts telling strangers where you are going, when you are leaving, or when your residence will be empty? Check your privacy settings and consider what you want to be seen publicly.
4. **Listen to your instincts.** Don't ignore something that makes you feel suspicious or uncomfortable with a situation. Remove yourself from the situation if possible, and call 911 if you feel you are in danger.
