This transfer guide is designed to assist students with their academic planning. Every effort is made to maintain accurate information; however, this information is subject to change as programs are updated. Students should contact the member institution to keep informed of changes, as final responsibility for verifying information rests with the student.

Bachelor of Business Administration

Students at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater may declare a business major at any point in their studies, including their freshman year. Any student who meets the admission requirements is admitted to the College of Business and Economics. No separate application is required.

Admission

The minimum combined GPA requirement varies depending on the number of credits you have earned. In order to declare a business major, the following minimum requirements must be met:

- Less than 24 credits = 2.0 combined GPA
- 24 + = 2.5 combined GPA

To progress towards completion of a business degree, students must have a minimum combined GPA of a 2.5 to register for the Business Core Requirements or any 300- or 400- level, business courses.

To register for the Business Core Requirements, students must complete the following:

- Must have a 2.5 combined cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Meet a course’s specific course prerequisite (i.e. to take ACCOUNT 249, ACCOUNT 244 must be completed first).

Submit the following materials:

- An official copy of your final high school transcript/GED/HSED with graduation date
- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities ever attended
 - If seeking credit for military experience: Official military Joint Services Transcript or DD214. JST can be requested from <https://jst.doded.mil>

Priority Deadlines

- Fall: July 1st
- Spring: December 1st

Students are encouraged to apply at least one semester prior to intended start term at UW-Whitewater



Calculation of Admission GPA

Grades from all transferable coursework will be used. Developmental transferrable coursework in English and Math are included. A repeated course grade will be used but only if the original grade is C- or lower. Please see the [UWW Repeat Policy](#) for more information regarding repeated courses.

Scholarships

Student's application for admission also serves as the scholarship application. Students must be admitted by April 1st to be considered for scholarships for the next fall semester start. Scholarship consideration is based on transfer GPA and credit amounts.

General Education Information

Students transferring **with** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- University-wide general education requirements as well as all CORE requirements below are satisfied with completion of an Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree from College of Lake County with the exception of the U.S Racial/Ethnic Diversity requirement.
- Students may complete the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course after transferring to UW-Whitewater. College of Lake County equivalents for the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course requirement are identified as **DV** in the General Education Transfer Guide.

Students transferring **without** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- **Applied Associate degrees do not waive students from general education requirements.**
- Students who do not earn the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree before transferring will have their coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis and may need to complete courses at UW-Whitewater if missing categories below
- Some majors require courses that serve as both degree requirements and satisfy General Education, especially in Business and Education majors. Please reach out to UW-Whitewater Transfer Admissions for more information

CORE classes:

- UW-Whitewater General Education requires students to take four of five multi-disciplinary courses: CORE 110, CORE 130, (CORE 120 or 140), and CORE 390. Based on number of credits transferred, CORE requirements may be satisfied with substitute courses as follows:
 - 20 credits or fewer: Students must complete all four CORE requirements.
 - 21-39 credits: Students must complete CORE 390 and one additional CORE course as assigned. The two remaining CORE requirements can be satisfied with GA, GE, GG, GH, or GS courses, as appropriate.
 - 40 credits or more: Students must complete CORE 390. The three remaining CORE requirements can be satisfied with appropriate GA, GE, GG, GH, and/or GS courses.
- CORE 390 is a class unique to UW-Whitewater and must be taken at UW-Whitewater.

Additional BBA Transfer Information

All College of Business and Economics grade point average requirements refer to a "combined cumulative" GPA. This GPA computation includes your transfer credits and grades along with your UW-Whitewater credits and grades. This policy means that your transfer record contributes to determining whether you're eligible all College of Business and Economics business courses (2.50 requirement) including freshman- and sophomore-level business courses, junior- and senior-level courses, and for graduation (2.50 requirement).

Your university degree requirements CORE courses may be personalized based on the number of credits you transfer. Be sure upon transfer to register for only the CORE courses required for you.

Regardless of the number of core courses you are required to take, you must meet the university (general education) requirements minimum of 32 units/credits and take the minimum in each area of university (general education) requirements. Your transfer institution may offer courses in a sequence that differs from the UW-Whitewater offerings. The most common examples of this discrepancy are in mathematics and economics. At UW-Whitewater, you will be required to complete finite mathematics unless you transfer in 8 or more credits of calculus. UW-Whitewater also requires courses in both macroeconomics and microeconomics. If you completed microeconomics, you will still need to take macroeconomics, and vice versa.

College of Business and Economics accepts up to 6 credits of transfer courses towards major requirements (300-400 level courses).

All Business students must complete a course with significant international content.

Course equivalencies specified in this guide are subject to change in the event that the course curricula of relevant programs at College of Lake County or at UW-Whitewater undergo revision.

This Transfer Guide is effective Spring25 and shall be reviewed every three years.
