

PROGRAM-TO-PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

UW-Whitewater and Madison College

This articulation agreement establishes a cooperative relationship between the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (UW-W) and Madison College, effective for students starting the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) program in or after the spring of 2021, which will assist both schools to better serve the educational needs of transfer students.

This agreement sets forth policies and procedures by which Madison College students may become eligible to enroll in the UW-W Bachelor of Social Work major, with a Human Services Foundation minor, in the College of Letters and Sciences. The agreement will be renewed at appropriate intervals, with content changes as deemed appropriate by both parties. The UW-W and Madison College reserve the right to make policy revisions, which may affect the contents of this agreement due to changes in the curriculum or quality standards at either institution.

1. Purpose of Articulation Agreement

This program-to-program articulation agreement between UW-W and Madison College allows students to be awarded up to 6 credits toward the Social Work major and up to 15 credits toward the Human Services Foundations minor if they meet the following criteria.

1.1 The UW-W will admit students who

- a. have applied to UW-W and submitted all appropriate documents and earned an applied associate degree in Human Services from Madison College with a grade point average of 2.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale), according to UW-W repeat policy **OR**
- b. have successfully completed all Human Services program requirements with a grade point average of 2.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale), according to the UW-W repeat policy, with the exception of Human Services Experiences Conference 1 and 2 (520-188 and 189).

1.2 The student must have declared a Social Work major and Human Services Foundations minor at UW-W.

3. General Education Requirements and Degree Requirements

- 3.1 The UW-W baccalaureate candidate must meet UW-W's general education requirements.
- 3.2 The UW-W baccalaureate candidate must meet the B.A. or B.S. requirements for the College of Letters and Sciences.

4. Admission to Program

- 4.1 Students must declare the Social Work major and Human Services Foundations minor at time of admission/transfer to UW-W.

5. Additional Conditions

- 5.1 Program-to-program transfer courses/credits are accepted only for the major and minor specified in this agreement. A change of major or minor invalidates these courses/credits for transfer unless they are approved within some other program-to-program articulation agreement for a different major/minor at UW-W.
- 5.2 Course equivalencies specified in this articulation agreement are subject to change in the event that the course curricula of relevant programs at Madison College or at UW-W undergo revision.
- 5.3 For students admitted from Madison College with a completed degree, 1.1.a above, the degree must be posted on an official transcript to receive credits from the agreement. For students admitted from Madison College with all credits toward degree completed except for 520-188 and 520-189, 1.1.b above, the credits must be posted on an official transcript to receive credits from the agreement. In addition, for students admitted under option 1.1.b. above, UW-Whitewater's Admissions Office must receive correspondence from the department chair or designee confirming that all credits towards the Human Services applied associate degree have been completed, except for 520-188 and 520-189.
- 5.4 Students who transfer from Madison College under this articulation agreement must complete 6 credits toward the Human Services Foundations minor at UW-W.
- 5.5 Students who are admitted through option 1.1.b above by completing all the requirements toward a Madison College Human Services degree, except for 520-188 and 520-189, can complete SW 493 at UW-W and transfer those credits back to Madison College in order to satisfy the remaining requirements in Madison College's applied associate degree in Human Services.

6. Articulation Procedure

- 6.1 The maximum number of credits that can be transferred from college transfer institutions to UW-W is 72.
- 6.2 Students transferring will either have met all requirements for Madison College's applied associate degree in Human Services, option 1.1.a above, with a minimum of 2.0 cumulative GPA, according to UW-W repeat policy; or have met all requirements except 520-188 and 520-189, with a minimum of 2.0 cumulative GPA, according to UW-W repeat policy, option 1.1.b above.
- 6.3 Entering students may apply general education credits toward satisfying UW-W general education requirements as specified in Transferology.
- 6.4 Review and renewal of this agreement will be made at appropriate intervals.

- 6.5 The UW-W and Madison College reserve the right to make policy and program changes, which could affect the content of this agreement, due to changes in the curriculum or quality standards at either institution.
- 6.6 The UW-W and Madison College agree to assist each other in appropriately promoting this agreement in their respective marketing materials, events, websites, and reports.
