

## Our support programs meet you where you are

### Center for Students with Disabilities

UW-Whitewater is known as being one of the most accessible campuses in Wisconsin, with about 10% of students using the services of the Center for Students with Disabilities. The center actively collaborates with students, faculty, and staff to create an inclusive, accessible university experience.

### PB Poorman Pride Center

The Pride Center offers an open and welcoming space for all LGBTQ+ and ally students to relax, study and socialize. It serves as a hub for sharing information about LGBTQ+ resources and services on campus, including all-gender bathrooms, inclusive housing, trans healthcare, and the use of preferred names and pronouns.

### LIFE Program

The LIFE (Learning Is for Everyone) Program provides a complete college experience — ample supports, specialized instruction, on-campus residential living, and community integration — for young adults aged 18-25 who have an intellectual disability.

### Veterans Services

Veterans Services provides educational and training support of prospective and enrolled service members, veterans, and their dependents or survivors, including benefit and education counseling and the Veterans and Service Members Lounge.

### Bridge Programs

The Upward Bound program at UW-Whitewater provides support to high school students as they gear up to take on college-level coursework and career expectations. Upward Bound students benefit from advising and tutoring help and participate in a six-week summer camp to prepare them for their first year on campus.

Summer bridge programs at UW-Whitewater are proven to improve GPA and graduation rates, preparing Warhawks for college life. Programs like STEM Boot Camp, King-Chávez Program, Future Teachers Program, and McNair Scholars offer an early introduction into the UW-Whitewater college environment and additional support throughout their college journey.


# Achieve Here

From stargazing as a child in his hometown of Evansville to working as an undergraduate researcher inside UW-Whitewater's Upham Hall, Nick Barmore has always had an interest in space. That passion earned Barmore a prestigious \$4,000 grant from NASA and the Wisconsin Space Grant Consortium. Steven Girard, an associate professor of chemistry, served as Barmore's faculty advisor for the project.

“At a larger school, you might not have the opportunity to use the high-pressure liquid chromatograph or run the powder X-ray diffractometer yourself,” Girard said. “But here — because of our smaller class sizes — we have the opportunity to really impart those skills with our students.”

## Reach beyond the classroom

Warhawks have **the opportunity to do amazing things** — from creating and launching their own businesses using resources in the Innovation Center and the Community Engagement Center, to participating in study abroad opportunities, competing in international competitions and presenting at national conferences.

Undergraduate students working closely with their faculty mentors have co-authored papers published in the Cambridge University Press, conducted research for the National Science Foundation, facilitated the university's designation as a Green Ribbon School — a rare sustainability accolade — and **performed at Carnegie Hall.**


