HEALTH SERVICE:

Should you require medical attention, the camp health supervisor will assess appropriate measures to take. UW-Whitewater camps have the full cooperation of Fort Atkinson Memorial Hospital and emergency room personnel. For participants taking medication, please complete the [health form](#) prior to arrival.

COVID-19 TESTING REQUIREMENT:

Participants coming to campus for multi-day overnight or commuter events will need to have a **COVID test within 3 days of the start of camp**. Documentation of a negative test will be reviewed PRIOR to the check-in process on-site. To minimize delays in the check-in process, we encourage testing prior to arriving on campus. Visit [Wisconsin DHS](#) site, or [Illinois DHS](#) site for testing sites near you. At-home testing kits will not be permitted for use.

Exceptions to on-campus testing, with valid documentation, include:

- Participants who have completed their entire vaccination process more than 14 days prior to the start of camp. Free vaccinations are now available on all UW System campuses for children 12+. Proof of vaccination will be required. Show your CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card or print your immunization record.
- Participants who have received a COVID test within 3 days of coming to campus at another location. Proof of a negative test will be required.
- Participants who have tested positive, and are asymptomatic, more than 14 days but less than 90 days prior to the start of camp. Proof of a positive test will be required.

UW-Whitewater will have an on-site testing clinic at Drumlin Hall for participants available at no cost the day of your event. Testing days and times are 10:00 am - 7:00 pm, 7 days a week. If you intend to be tested on campus, please plan on arriving 60-90 minutes prior to your camp check-in time, as test results will need to be confirmed. Please plan accordingly with your designated camp check-in time.

COVID-19 SAFETY PROCOTOLS:

- All participants are expected to maintain social distancing guidelines at all times.
- Masks will be required at all times unless wearing them during specific activities creates additional safety concerns. Exceptions include during play (if social distancing can be observed), during meals, and in personal living spaces.
- We encourage all participants to get vaccinated if possible. However, being vaccinated prior to coming to camp does not excuse anyone from the UW-Whitewater safety protocols.
- Participants and staff will be broken into groups of 25 or fewer. To decrease the risk of possible transmission, members of each group will not be allowed to interact with other groups.
- Overnight participants will be assigned residence hall roommates from their group.
- In addition to masks, all UW-Whitewater staff will wear personal protective equipment (PPE) when required by UW-Whitewater safety protocols.
- Drills and activities will be designed to prevent contact between participants.
- Meals in the dining halls will be served by UW-Whitewater staff rather than buffet style.
- UW-Whitewater occupancy limits for all indoor and outdoor facilities will be strictly followed. The occupancy limits are set to allow continuous social distancing during activities.
- PPE and hand sanitizer will be available and its use encouraged regularly.
- Directional signs, scheduling, and other processes will be in place to reduce congestion whenever possible, ex: dorm lobbies, bathrooms, dining halls, etc.

DINING/DIETARY SERVICES

All campers will be served lunch and dinner from the dining halls. Any special dietary needs and questions can be accommodated/answered there by our full-time dietician. All dietary questions or concerns should be directed to Chef Mike (262-443-4324) or Matt Bennett (262-716-7798).

MONEY:

Campers are not required to bring any money to camp, but it is up to their discretion. Camp staff is not responsible for lost or stolen property. The University Bookstore has mementos and souvenirs that campers can purchase during store hours. Many campers will spend money on ice cream or pizza at night, too.

APPAREL:

Campers will receive a camp t-shirt during their time at camp, if registered before June 6, 2021.

HOUSING:

The campers will be housed in one our University's residence halls, where our staff will also be living during the week.



COMMUTER CAMPERS:

Commuter campers can arrive at the designated check-in time and location. Only lunch and dinner will be served to commuter campers. Report to camp before the first session of the day after breakfast. Authorized driver can pick up commuter camper at the conclusion of camp after checking out.

Assumption of Risks:

I understand that not all risks can be foreseen and there are some risks which are unpredictable. I understand that certain inherent risks that cannot be eliminated regardless of the care taken to avoid injuries. I am aware of the risks of participation, which include, but are not limited to, the possibility of physical injury, fatigue, bruises, contusions, broken bones, concussion, paralysis, and even death. I understand that the university has advised me to seek the advice of my physician before participating in the University of Wisconsin – Whitewater Tennis Camp field trip to the Whitewater High School tennis courts. I understand that I have been advised to have health and accident insurance in effect and that no such coverage is provided for me by the University or the State of Wisconsin. I know, understand, and appreciate the risks that are inherent in the above-listed programs and activities. I hereby assert that my participation is voluntary and that I knowingly assume all such risks.

Hold Harmless, Indemnity and Release:

In consideration of my participation in these activities, I, for myself, spouse, heirs, personal representatives, estate or assigns, agree to defend, hold harmless, indemnify and release the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System, the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, and their officers, employees, agents, volunteers, and all others who are involved, from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, or causes of action of any sort on account of damage to personal property, or personal injury, or death which may result from my participation in the above-listed program. This release includes claims based on the negligence of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System, the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, and their officers, employees, agents, and volunteers, but expressly does not include claims based on their intentional misconduct or gross negligence. **I understand that by agreeing to this clause I am releasing claims and giving up substantial rights, including my right to sue.**
