- 3. Program revision: <u>Health and Leadership Studies</u>
 - i. Sarah Hessenauer moved to approve D1-2, seconded by Paul House. Sarah explained the proposals.
 - a. D1-There was a need for an introductory course.
 - b. D2-This is a portfolio course at the end of the program.
 - ii. Change 25-character abbreviation. Angela will edit.
 - iii. A question was raised about staffing. Sarah stated support from the Dean.
 - iv. No further questions. Vote passed unanimously, none opposed, no abstentions.

D3

- i. Sarah moved to approve D3, seconded by Paul House. Sarah explained the proposal.
- ii. This is for AAS degree students transferring to UW-W.
- iii. Several suggestions were made for corrections and clarity, including adding the transfer credits from the AAS degree to the major. Angela will make these changes.
- iv. Two additional courses were suggested for elective and unique requirement areas, COMPSCI 180 Data Science for Everyone and POLISCI ???
- v. Question was raised about consultation with Biology given BIOLOGY 303 in the unique requirements. Angela will follow up.
- vi. There was a robust discussion of the impact this and other new programs have on staffing for general education. Angela will add a statement to the proposal. Reminder: What is written on the proposal matters in the future. If we say we will not need staffing, we will likely not get staffing in the future. We need to state, "This will increase enrollment" in order to have increased staffing. There was a suggestion to add a second box to CourseLeaf for staffing:
 - a. Affect staffing internally
 - b. Affect staffing outside the program
- vii. Wesley moved to table the proposal, seconded by Nathan McGovern. Vote passed unanimously with no abstentions.

E. COMPUTER SCIENCE
