Nathan Burkart - Executive Director of the Janesville Performing Arts Center

Nathan Burkart is the Executive Director of the Janesville Performing Arts Center in Janesville, WI. He holds a BFA in Musical Theatre from Webster University in St. Louis, and lived in Los Angeles for 8 years as a professional actor. Past professional work experience includes being the founder and Board President of the Los Angeles New Court Theatre, working as a Studio Manager at Zak Barnett Acting Studios in Hollywood, CA, and serving as a manager of Jinky's Kanan Café in Agoura Hills, CA. His past professional acting credits include a range of experiences from JACK AND JILL, starring Adam Sandler, to the St. Louis Rep. Nathan was hand selected to work with Edward Albee on a reading of his play ME MYSELF AND I with Playwrights Horizons in NYC. Since becoming JPAC's ED in 2016 he has helped the organization develop numerous different productions and helped raise attendance totals by over 13,000 patrons annually.

Anne Katz has served as the Executive Director of Arts Wisconsin since 1995. She is an activist who believes in the power of the arts to strengthen and sustain communities and people.
