

UW-WHITewater CENTER FOR COMMUNICATIVE DISORDERS Clinic Services

The clinic provides services to members of the community, the UW-Whitewater Children's Center, faculty/staff, and students on campus. Graduate students provide individualized and group therapy services and are supervised on-site by a licensed speech-language pathologist.

APHASIA CLINIC

This clinic provides meaningful opportunities for socialization and functional use of compensatory communication strategies for generalization into activities of daily living.

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY CLINIC

This clinic specifically focuses on functional use of compensatory strategies for cognitive/linguistic deficits and promotion of independence in activities of daily living.

CHILDREN'S CENTER

Graduate students conduct speech, language, and hearing screenings for children attending the 3-and 4-year old classrooms. Low cost individualized or small group intervention is available targeting improved speech, language, and literacy skills for children who may benefit.

PEDIATRIC CLINIC

Individual and small group speech, language, and literacy therapy sessions are scheduled for pediatric clients, ranging in age from approximately 18 months to 18 years of age.

ASSORTED SERVICES:

Fluency, voice, augmentative and alternative communication, community education, and hearing screenings

COMMUNITY PARTNERS:

UWW-Life: small group sessions targeting social skills and communication for students participating in the UWW-Life program on campus

St. Coletta's: small group session targeting activities of daily living and safety

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Clinic treatment programs start at the beginning of the fall and spring semesters; however, referrals are accepted throughout the year. Most sessions are scheduled two times per week, 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday.
