Jane Blain Gilbertson

Jane Blain Gilbertson is executive chair and sole owner of the 45 Blain's Farm & Fleet stores throughout Wisconsin, Illinois, Iowa, and Michigan and Blain Supply, Inc., headquartered in Janesville, Wisconsin. The family-owned companies were founded in 1955 and currently employ 5,500 associates.

Jane is a Janesville resident who received her Bachelor of Science in Retailing from Miami University (Miami of Ohio). Upon graduation, she joined Macy's as a buyer.

Jane returned to Blain's in 1985 as a buyer for the company. After the passing of the company's founders, her uncle Claude Blain in 1988 and her father Bert Blain in 1993, Jane and her brother Robert purchased the remaining portion of the company from Claude's family and became the sole owners in 1998.

In 2014, Jane purchased her brother's half of the business and became CEO, president, and sole owner. In September 2024, Jane named Mark Hasting as the CEO and president, and she became executive chair of the board.

She has been married to Mick Gilbertson, an architect, for nearly 39 years, and both of their children, Sarah and Nicole, work for the family business as well.

Jane serves as vice chair of Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce's Wisconsin Chamber of Commerce and is board member of the Wisconsin Women's Health Foundation, Janesville Performing Arts Center, and Greater Madison Chamber of Commerce. In the past she was community board president of St. Mary's Hospital in Janesville, director of the Rock County 5.0 Economic Development Organization, and community board director of Johnson Bank, Bank One, Blackhawk Technical College Foundation and the Rock County Habitat for Humanity, among others.

Her recognitions include Forward Janesville's Lifetime Achievement Award, Rock County Historical Society Phoenix Award, BizTime's "Wisconsin 275" in 2022 and 2024, Forward Janesville's Athena Award, and YWCA Rock County's Woman of Distinction and Corporate Citizen Awards. She was the inaugural awardee of both Craig High School graduates' Honor Wall of Fame and the Janesville Gazette's "50 Who Matter." •

UW-WHITEWATER AT ROCK COUNTY

UW-Whitewater at Rock County is part of a leading comprehensive university that serves almost 12,000 students. The Rock County campus offers a general studies associate degree, a Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences, a collaborative nursing bachelor's degree and a collaborative engineering bachelor's degree.

The Whitewater campus offers bachelor's degrees with more than 60 majors, 22 master's degrees, and one doctoral degree. The Rock County campus houses the College of Integrated Studies; other colleges at UW-Whitewater are Arts and Communication, Business and Economics, Education and Professional Studies, Letters and Sciences, and the School of Graduate Studies. ❖

ACADEMIC AND STUDENT REGALIA

Gowns and robes represent the principal levels of academic achievement. The associate and bachelor's gown have long, open sleeves. The UW-Whitewater chancellor wears a medallion that signifies the history and aspirations of the university. The medallion is cast and constructed in sterling silver and gold plate.

Stoles and cords worn by students may represent students' ethnic background, country of origin, academic achievement, or membership in a student organization:

- Green and gold cords signify membership in Sigma Kappa Delta, the English honor society for two-year colleges.
- Purple and white cords signify honor students based on cumulative gradepoint average.
- * Red, white, and blue cords indicate a veteran or military student.
- ❖ Blue and yellow cords indicate Phi Theta Kappa, the English Honor Society.
- Red and gold cords indicate the Spanish Honor Society.
- ❖ Red cords indicate the TRIO program.
- Many-colored stoles indicate membership in Latinos Unidos.
