Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has served with distinction the Department of Sociology, Criminology & Anthropology as Professor, 1993-2017; as Associate Professor, 1989-1993; and as Assistant Professor, 1983-1989 at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater for 34 years; and

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has taught eighteen different courses at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, plus led a Travel Study to Thailand & Vietnam in January 2005 and another one to Japan in May 2005, March 2006, May 2007 and May 2008, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has published six books, four in multiple editions and three into foreign translation, as well as more than 20 journal articles and 11 book chapters and 17 other publications across areas that include Asian studies, social problems, criminal justice, research methods, political sociology, social class, race and ethnicity, and culture, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has provided 40 presentations, research reports or invited lectures, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has been an active and collegial member of the Department, mentor to younger faculty, and mentor to undergraduate students, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has served as Chair of the Department, Founder and Coordinator of the Japanese Studies Major, Coordinator of the Family, Health & Disability Studies Program, Coordinator of the Study Abroad Exchanges with Kansai Gaidai University and Sophia University in Japan, Coordinator of the Asian Studies Minor Program, Assistant Director of the Global Business Research Business Center, Administrative Intern to Vice Present for Academic Affairs, and Assistant Dean for the School of Graduate Studies, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman has served on countless committees at the department, college, university, has served in several committees for improving general shared governance, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman was a Fellow in the UW System Teaching Fellows Program, the Chancellor's Award in Recognition of Assistance to Disabled Students, a Phi Kappa Phi member, earned the College of Letters & Sciences Outstanding Service Award, Outstanding Researcher Award, and Outstanding Teaching Award, the UW Whitewater University Award for Outstanding Research, and the Wisconsin Sociological Association George Floro Service to the Discipline Award, and;

Whereas, Professor Lawrence Neuman was principle investigator on forty grants, and;
