B. Submit a Verification of Non-filing Letter from the IRS. To obtain this online, go to <u>https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript</u>. To order this by mail, complete Form 4506-T, which can be found at <u>http://www.uww.edu/financialaid/forms</u>. Complete steps 1-4, check the box in #7, Verification of Non-filing and in #9, use 12/31/2019 as the date. Mail or fax the form based on your state of residence. Once you receive the Non-filing letter from the IRS, please submit it to us.

If you have attempted to obtain the Verification of Non-filing Letter from the IRS, but were unable to obtain it, please sign the statement below **and** on the back of this form.

- 3. If your spouse answered YES to #1, they must provide the tax information to the Financial Aid Office. They can do this in one of two ways:
  - A. Go to <u>fafsa.gov</u> and log in using your FSA ID and password. Your spouse can retrieve tax data directly from the IRS. If the FAFSA indicates your spouse is not eligible for this process, please go to step B.
  - B. Request a tax transcript from the Internal Revenue Service and submit this transcript to the Financial Aid Office. Go to <a href="https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript">https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript</a>.
