a student-athlete with outside speakers to work with students to translate their personal skillset for the workforce.

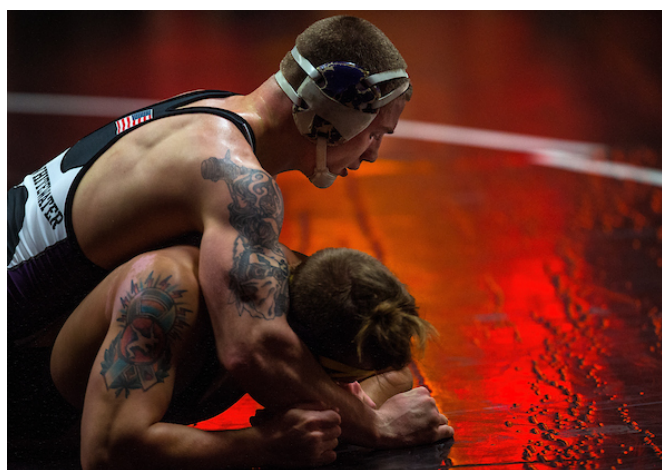
