



UWW Wireless: Connection a NEW Android Device

Overview

This guide will walk you through the steps to connect your Android device to the UWW wireless network.

Note: Devices connecting to wireless will only stay active in the system for 2 years. At that time, the device must go through the wireless registration process again. A total of 15 devices can be registered to the wireless network at one time for each user. You can manage your registered wireless devices by going to mydevices.uww.edu

Note: Registering a device on the wireless network using the steps below replaces the need to reset your Net-ID password on your device after a password change.

Step 1:

Navigate to your Settings menu and select Connections. Select “UWW” under available Networks.

Step 2:

You will then be prompted for more information, please fill in the following:

EAP method: **PEAP**

Phase 2 authentication: **MSCHAPV2**

CA certificate: **Don't validate**

Identity: **Your UWW Net-ID**

Password: **Your UWW Password**

Leave the Anonymous Identity field blank.

Select Connect when finished.
