The TCA grants approval for study abroad credits to transfer back to UW-Whitewater.
- Academic Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 units of UWW course
 work is required to qualify for an undergraduate degree. At least 15 of these 30
 units must be taken at UWW immediately prior to graduation. See your

- Students pursuing any major in the BBA curriculum must complete course work in at least six courses (18-unit minimum) in their major field. A maximum of two transfer courses may count in the BBA major. See your academic advisor
- <u>Students must attend a Course Approval Workshop</u> to complete the above Transfer Credit Agreement Worksheet with the proper Advising Coordinator(s) to receive academic approval for courses abroad. Students must bring the course descriptions for their intended courses to this meeting.
