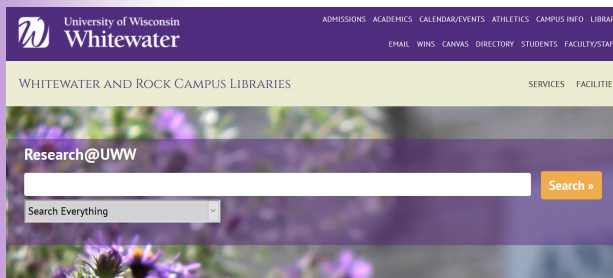
Library Web Site Usability
