

Why It's Important:



A lack of transportation can stand between a person and their health and food resources. Ride United ensures that reliable, affordable transportation is never a barrier to accessing critical resources.




THESE 4 WALLS

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT UNITED WAY

O1 LOGAL

United Way of Jefferson and N. Walworth Counties is a local, independent, nonprofit organization governed by a local volunteer board of directors. In exchange for nominal dues, United Way Worldwide provides training, community research information, local resources and ongoing consultation services to local United Way offices.

HOW ARE UNITED WAY INVESTMENTS DETERMINED?

Investment decisions are made by volunteers from the community. As part of a competitive grant process, community volunteers meet to review submitted proposals aimed at achieving the community impact goals and addressing the areas of focus (see #7). Proposals showing the greatest ability to meet the goals are awarded funding.

O3 DOES MY GIFT MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

When you invest in United Way, you join thousands of local supporters who have raised their hands, opened their hearts, dug in, shared resources, and supported programs for a thriving region. From \$1 to \$1 million every gift matters. O5 RIDE UNITED

Ride United provides FREE transportation to and from the Jefferson County Food Pantries and Medical Clinics. The service is coordinated through Brown Cab and is fully funded by the United Way of Jefferson and N. Walworth Counties.

06 DIAL 2-1-1

United Way 2-1-1 is your link to community resources. When you dial 2-1-1, you will be connected to a trained specialist who is available 24/7/365 with access to a comprehensive database of services in Jefferson and N. Walworth Counties. This three digit hotline number can connect you with information and resources including information related to emergency food and shelter, rent and utility assistance, elderly or child care services, consumer help, volunteer opportunities, crisis intervention, healthcare, and more. A call to United Way 2-1-1 is free, confidential and available 24/7.

O7 AREAS OF FOCUS

Our focus areas allow United Way to respond to the most urgent needs in the community. These areas of focus are: basic needs, financial stability, health and education.

O8 COMMUNITY FUND

The United Way Community Fund is a grant opportunity for area nonprofits to help address emerging or emergency community needs. Grant requests made for the Community Fund are heard by the a group of volunteer community members and the United Way Board of Directors (also consisting of volunteers) for final approval.

09 LEGACY GIVING
