Teaching the Music of Language: Exploring Rhythm, Reading, and Writing

A Four-part Online Course for Teachers of All Grade Levels

Do students really hear the musical foundations of language? Can they feel the accents, inflections, and rhythms in words when they speak? Can they write with an attentiveness to cadence and phrasing?

In this Teaching the Music of Language online training you'll discover how to guide students through a whole new approach to reading and writing. And you'll learn how to teach these TML lessons both in-person and online.

This arts integration workshop includes four active, participatory 2-hour online sessions. You'll start by learning how to lead simple movement warm-ups that help students hear and feel the musical patterns of language. Then learn how to read poetry and rhythmic literature with accurate timing and phrasing. And you'll explore how poets use musical devices such as rhythm, rhyme, alliteration, and form to shape and craft their phrases. Finally, discover how to use any topic, including science, literature, and history, as a springboard for student poetry writing.

This course dovetails beautifully with Dr. Rosalind Flynn's Curriculum-Based Reader's Theatre workshop series that was offered in the fall semester. Recommended for teachers of ALL students.
